Label The labeling submitted with the above letter, under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided you submit one (1) copy of final printed labeling to us, with the following changes, before you ship your product. 1. Under "CAUTION", delete "or fatal". 2. Under "Urban Areas" in the 2nd Sentence, delete "and around". 3. On the Front Panel, change "Warfarin-Resistant House Mice" to Warfarin-Resistant Norway Rats". Existing Stocks of existing labels may be used for eighteen (18) months. stocks If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject Consequence for nonto cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for compliance shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

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Formatting The Agency believes that the readability of the text could be improved if you changed the formatting of the label in certain areas:

- 1. In your **"FIRST AID**" and **"NOTE TO PHYSICIAN**" sections, consider clarifying the distinctions between headings, subheadings, and text, as shown by Enclosures 1 and 2.
- 2. Under "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL", consider bolding and/or capitalizing "Storage", "Pesticide Disposal:", and "Container Disposal:" to clarify these subheadings and the accompanying texts, as LiphaTech had proposed on its last stamped, accepted labeling for this product on December 19, 2000.




