Purpose

The purpose of this submission is to revise the label of this product, under section 3 of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA).

Label

The labeling submitted with the above letter, under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided you submit one (1) copy of final printed labeling to us, with the following change, before you ship your product.

- 1. Revise the 1st Sentence of your "USE RESTRICTIONS" to read, "This product may **only** be used to control Norway rats, roof rats and house mice."
- 2. Revise the 2nd Sentence under "CAUTION", wherever it occurs, to read: "May be harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin because it may reduce the clothing ability of blood and cause bleeding."
- 3. Under "MICE", delete "Two pieces may be needed at points of very high mouse activity." as 40z of bait is excessive. Our current maximum placement for mice is 2 oz.

4. Under "For sewer", revise the last sentence to read: "Place at least one entire bait block per manhole." The proposed sentence, a departure from the previously accepted label, "Place at least 15 bait blocks per manhole." would be excessive and unacceptable."

Note: In the future, include an Amended Application Form (EPA Form 8570-1) when amending the labeling of a product.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

READ THIS LABEL and follow all use directions and use precautions

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets or other nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help prevent accidents:

1. Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.

2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals, and nontarget wildlife, or in tamperresistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hoofed livestock, raccoons, bears, other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.

3. Dispose of product container, unused, spoiled, and unconsumed bait as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS: This product may be used to control Norway rats, roof rats and house mice. Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not contaminate water, food, feedstuffs, food or feed handling equipment, or milk or meat handling equipment. Do not broadcast bait.

Urban Areas: This product may be used in and around homes, industrial, commercial, agricultural and public building, food processing facilities and similar man-made structures. May also be used in transport vehicles (ships, trains, aircraft) and in and around related port or terminal buildings. This product may also be used in alleys.

Non-urban Areas: May only be used inside of homes, agricultural, industrial and commercial buildings.

Selection of Treatment Areas: Determine areas where rats or mice will most likely find and consume bait. Generally, these are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors or walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

(Qualifier statement for 12 oz block:)

This package contains enough bait (12 oz.) to kill 3 to 12 rats.

Each bait block is scored to be broken into 2-oz. pieces. Mice: Apply one 2-oz. piece of block per placement, usually spaced 8 to 12 feet apart. Two pieces may be needed at points of very high mouse activity. Maintain a constant supply of fresh bait for 15 days or until signs of mouse activity cease.

Rats: Apply two to eight 2-oz. pieces of block per placement, usually spaced 15 to 30 feet apart. Maintain a constant supply of fresh bait for 10 days or until signs of rat activity cease.

For sewer applications, securely attach one end of a wire to bait blocks and the other end to a stationary structure such as the bottom step of manhole ladder or to a sewer grate, allowing just enough wire for bait to rest on manhole benching. If benching is not present, suspend bait a few inches above the high water line or place bait on a board supported by opposing steps of the ladder. Securing bait in this manner will minimize chances for removal by rats or water. Place at least 15 bait blocks per manhole

Follow-up: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Wearing gloves, collect and dispose of all visible dead animals and leftover bait as well as any bait that has become accessible to non-target animals. To discourage reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation occurs, repeat treatment. For a continuous infestation, set up permanent bait stations and replenish bait as needed.
