PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazard to Humans and Domestic Animals

CAUTION: Keep away from children, domestic animals and pets. May be harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin because it may reduce the clotting ability of blood and cause bleeding. FIRST AID

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. Dogs and other predatory and scavenging mammals and birds might be poisoned if they feed upon animals that have eaten the bait. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

ENDANGERED SPECIES CONSIDERATIONS: NOTICE: It is a Federal offense to use any pesticide in a manner that results in the death of an endangered species. Use of this product may pose a hazard to endangered or threatened species. Before applying this product, applicators must obtain information regarding the occurrence of endangered species and use limitations for this product. FRUIT TREE ORCHARDS (BEARING AND NONBEARING) FOR PINE, MEADOW OR MOUNTAIN VOLE CONTROL:

USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of pine, meadow or mountain voles in pome fruit (apples, pear) and stone fruit (peaches, nectarines) tree orchards in the following states only: Idaho, Maryland, Michigan, Missouri, North Carolina, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Virginia, Vermont, Washington and West Virginia. Apply after fall harvest (including drops), before new spring growth, and during which three days of rain-free and snow-free weather are expected. Do not apply over bare ground or crops not specified above. Do not allow animals to graze or clean up drops in treated areas. Do not use hay cut after application for feed or bedding. Apply only by hand spot baiting and ground broadcasting (except New York and Vermont).

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS: Before application, examine orchard floor to locate trails and runway systems to be treated.

Hand spot baiting: Place about 1-1/2 ounces of bait in each active hole, trail or runway at each tree site (10 lbs per acre). Cover each placement with grass or shingle to avoid exposing nontarget organisms.

Ground broadcast baiting: Using a commercial spreader, uniformly apply 20 lbs per acre for Pine voles (all states except Idaho, Oregon, Washington) and 10 lbs per acre for Meadow voles (all states except Oregon) and Mountain voles (Idaho, Oregon, Washington only). If populations are high, make a second application 1 - 2 months after the first. The maximum application rate is 10 lbs per acre per year for Pine voles, and 20 lbs per acre per year for Meadow and Mountain voles. To avoid exposing nontarget organisms, clean up any bait in piles for reuse or disposal according to the "Pesticide disposal" section of this label.

CHRISTMAS TREE FARMS, COMMERCIAL NURSERIES AND TREE PLANTATIONS FOR PINE, MEADOW OR MOUNTAIN VOLE CONTROL:

USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of Pine or Meadow voles in Christmas tree farms, commercial nurseries and tree plantations in the following states only: North Carolina and Ohio.

Apply when 3 days of good weather are expected. Follow all other USE RESTRICTIONS and APPLICATION DIRECTIONS as listed for fruit tree orchards above.

FORESTRY PLANTATIONS FOR MEADOW VOLE CONTROL:

USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of Pine or Meadow voles in forest plantations in the following states only: Idaho.

Do not apply over bare ground or crops not specified above. Apply only by hand spot baiting. Do not graze animals in treated areas. Do not use hay cut after application for feed or bedding.

Burrowing owl protection: Determine the locations of any active burrowing sites, where applications are prohibited. Contact the Idaho Dept. of Agriculture for information on burrowing owls and if considering use on the Birds of Prey National Wildlife Area.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS: Before application, examine forest floor to locate trails and runway systems to be treated.

Hand spot baiting: Place about 2 tablespoons of bait in each active hole, trail or runway at each tree site. At sites where bait is removed, add bait for 5 to 7 consecutive days. Do not exceed 10 lbs per acre. Cover each placement with grass or shingle to avoid exposing nontarget organisms. If populations are high, make a second application, not to exceed 10 lbs per acre. The total bait application must not exceed 20 lbs per acre per year. After treatment program, collect unconsumed bait and dispose of according to the "Pesticide disposal" section of this label.
