- 2. Wherever it occurs, delete the claim, this product kills "Warfarin-Resistant House Mice" as we have no data supporting the claim for Bromadiolone baits.

- 3. Until such time as a claim for use of this product in sewers is accepted, the phrase "and sewers" must be deleted from the second sentence of the "SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS:" paragraph. In the same sentence, replace "rodents or their signs" with "signs of rodents".
- 4. Until a claim for use of this product in sewers is accepted, delete the "For sewer applications ... manhole" paragraph from the "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:" pertaining to "Rats:".
- 5. For the 12-oz block only, insert the following sentence at the start of the "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:" subsection:

One 12-ounce bait block provides enough bait to kill 3 to 12 rats.

When acceptable rat and mouse efficacy data on weathered bait are submitted, the second sentence of the "Urban Areas:" paragraph below may be changed to "This product also may be used in sewers". If the sewer claim is desired and/or supported only for Norway rats, the new second sentence would read "This product also may be used to control Norway rats in sewers."

If "weathered" claims are sought for this product, new trials with "weathered" baits would have to be run. See enclosed efficacy comments.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Remove as much alternative food as possible. APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

Each block is scored to be broken into 2-oz. pieces.

Mice: Break block and apply one 2-oz. piece per placement.
Space placements 8 to 12 feet apart. Maintain a constant supply of fresh bait for 15 days or until fresh signs of mouse

supply of restr dual for 15 days or until resh sighs of mouse activity cease.

Rats: Apply two to eight 2-oz, pieces of block per placement, usually spaced 15 to 30 feet apart. Maintain a constant supply of feeth bail for 10 days or until fresh sighs of rat activity cease. For burrow applications, insert one or two 2 oz, pieces of block deep into each active burrow. Check treated burrows each morning and evening to make sure that bait has not been pushed out of burrows.

For sewer applications, securely attach one end of a wire to bait blocks and the other end to a stationary structure such as the bottom step of manhole ladder or to a sewer grate, allowing just enough wire for bait to rest on manhole benching. If beriching is not present, suspend bait a few inches above the high water line or place bait on a board supported by opposing steps of the ladder. Securing bait in this manner will minimize chances for removal by rats or water. Place at least one entire gait block per manhole.
