DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Apply with a regular sprayer giving a coarse spray for the control of fleas in and around supermarkets, restaurants, homes, institutions, warehouses, furniture storages, libraries, laundry trucks and dog kennels. Will not mix with water. Do not dilute.

FLEAS IN BUILDINGS, LAUNDRY TRUCKS AND PET QUARTERS: Apply 1 gallon of CROWN FLEA SPRAY per 1000 sq. ft. Spray thoroughly floors, walls, rugs, carpets, cracks, crevices, sleeping quarters of pets or other infested areas where fleas breed and harbor. Remove bedding of pets after treatment. Re-treat as necessary.

Do not use in edible products areas of food processing plants, restaurants or other areas where food is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food is exposed.

NOTE: The solvent used in this formulation is a petroleum distillate which may stain certain plastic, rubber and asphalt materials, tiles and floor coverings. Do not treat such materials. Care should be taken to avoid spotting of wall-paper and fabrics. Carpet and fabric should always be tested for color fastness by dampening an inconspicuous area with this product, and pressing a white tissue to the dampened area. If a color transfer or change occurs, do not use product as damage to carpet or fabric will result.

When used in dwellings, care should be taken to avoid deposits which could be frequently contacted by children. Do not allow children in treated areas until surfaces are dry.

FLEAS IN LAWNS AND KENNEL RUNS: Spray to wet localized infestations. Re-treat as necessary. Keep children off treated area until spray has detail.
