

blankets can be sanitized by soaking in a similar solution and allowing it to dry on the material, or by spraying with a double strength (two teaspoons per gallon of water) and allowing it to dry on the cloth.

Pet kennels, blankets, rugs, etc.:

Sanitize with a solution of one teaspoon per gallon of water, wiped or sprayed on.

RIGHT SIDE PANEL:

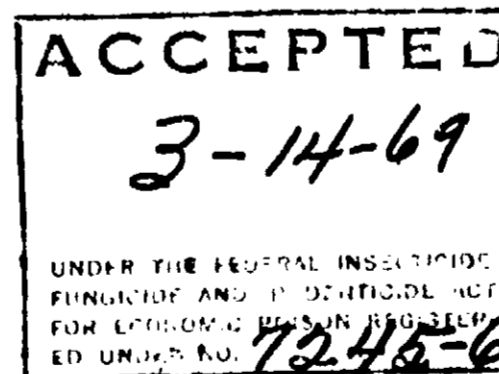
Pet washings:

Use a solution of 1/2 teaspoon of Germicidal per gallon of water to wash dogs, control "doggy" odors due to skin bacteria.
