HI-PRESSURE INSECT BOMB

DIRECTIONS—Remove pets, birds and fish-bowls. Cover exposed foods, dishes and food handling equipment. Open cabinets and doors to be treated. Shut off fans and air conditioning. Put out all flames and turn off all gas stoves and water heaters. Point valve up and away from face and eyes when releasing insect bomb for each 10,000 cu. ft. of unobstructed area.

TO OPERATE VALVE—Can be used manually or automatically. To operate manually, turn valve to open position. Turn handle clockwise until valve button is all the way forward. For checking the catch, turn top of meter handle. For automatic operation, set meter manually to spray forward for 4 to 6 seconds (average 5 seconds) per room. A spray meter will spray 100 cubic feet of insecticide per minute. After spraying, turn valve to closed position. Turn handle clockwise until valve is open. Shake and agitate and keep bulb depressed for 10 to 15 seconds. Open doors and windows and allow to air for 10 minutes. Repeat spraying whenever necessary.

CAUTION—Contents under pressure. Do not puncture. Exposure to prolonged sunlight or other sources of heat may cause bursting. Do not shake violently or operate. Do not spray on water, carpet, tile or plastic. Do not spray over exposed food. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs.

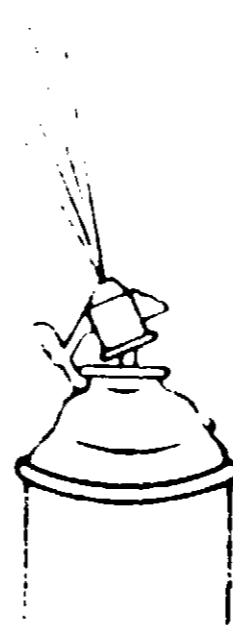
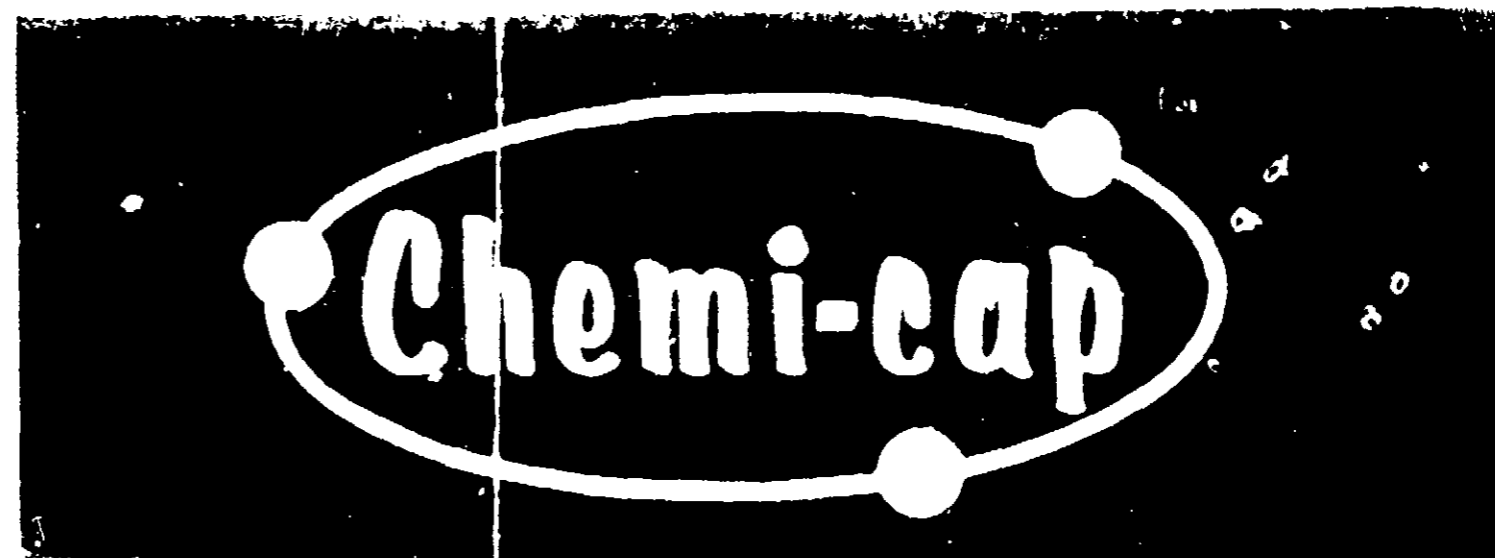
