Your letter dated December 7, 1989.

Dear Mr. Bajnath:

The labelling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, is acceptable if you make the following changes on the Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF):

1. The amounts of active ingredients reported in column 13(b) of the CSF must correspond to the amounts claimed on the Active Ingredients portion of the label. Revise the CSF accordingly.

2. The active ingredients [redacted] and [redacted] are listed for conversion from active to inert status. If you choose to convert these to inert status, provide the following information:

- c. Five (5) copies of the draft labeling, deleting the ingredients from the active ingredients statement and adding them to the inactive ingredients statement.

**DIRECTIONS:**  
It is a violation of federal law to use this labeling. Shut off fans and air lights. Close doors and windows. Wear eye protection when releasing. Use one bomb per area.

**TO OPERATE VALVE:** Can be used in open position. To lock valve in open position, rotate edge firmly until it locks under cover.

**FOR FLIES, FLEAS, TICKS, MOSQUITOES:**  
For best results first spray distant walls and ceiling with mist. Place bomb in area, then lock valve open. Leave bomb for 2 hours before airing out. Open door thoroughly. Repeat when necessary.

**FOR CRAWLING INSECTS: Roaches and Centipedes** — Spray thorough cracks, moist areas, openings and baseboards and storage areas. Spray thoroughly. Repeat when necessary.

**FOR ANTS:** Spray trails, nests and other. Repeat if necessary.

**PRECAUTIONS:**  
**HAZARDS TO HUMANS:**  
Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin or clothing. Avoid breathing mist. Do not spray on plants only when plant is not in open air during treatment. Food contact surfaces should be cleaned with compound. In hospitals, patients should be removed and room should be ventilated for 2 hours after use until after ventilation. Remove pets.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS:**  
**IF SWALLOWED:** Do not induce vomiting. Contact petroleum distillate pneumonia.

**IF INHALED:** Remove to fresh air.

**IF ON SKIN:** Wash with soap and water.

**IF IN EYES:** Flush eyes with plenty of water.

**PHYSICAL/Chemical:**  
Do not use or store near heat, sparks, or open flames. Do not puncture or incinerate container. 130°F (54°C) may cause bursting. Do not use on rayon fabrics.

**STORAGE:**  
Keep in a cool, dry, locked place. Avoid sources of heat or ignition. Contains petroleum.

**DISPOSAL:** Refasten cap on container. Do not contaminate water, food, or soil.
