DIRECTIONS

- (I) U.S. Army: Bombs may be dropped at the amount of not less than 5 grams each 1,000 ft. above ground space in the aircraft, and shall be released or sprayed through the most practicable compartments.
- (II) Disinsection may be accomplished either while the aircraft is in flight or while on the ground prior to take-off, but in no case shall disinsection be accomplished later than 20 minutes prior to the first landing at a United States port.
- (III) The ventilation system shall be stopped and all openings to the exterior kept closed while the insecticide is being released or sprayed, and for a period of not less than 15 minutes thereafter. If disinsection is accomplished on the ground prior to take-off, the ventilation system may be operated at the end of take-off, provided that the system is equipped with filter or other means for preventing the entrance of insects into the aircraft, but doors, windows, or other such opening to the exterior shall be kept closed until after the take-off, except in the case of emergency, or to permit persons applying the insecticide to deboard.

TO OPERATE ATOMIZER
