Dear Ms. Artis:

The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of Bug Barrier II Personal Insect Repellent (EPA Reg. No. 7754-41), in connection the DEET Reregistration Eligibility Decision (RED), and have concluded that your submission is acceptable with the following label revision provisions:

General Comment(s):

- Delete all text throughout the label marked with "strikethrough."
- 2. The words "INSECT REPELLENT" must be displayed prominently on the front panel of this label as well as on the alternate brand name(s), immediately after the brand name, in capital lettering, with large, contrasting, bold-faced type.

Marketing Claims section comment(s):

- 3. In the 6th marketing claim, clarify which type(s) of encephalitis.
- 4. In the 6th marketing claim, delete Dengue Fever since this insect-borne disease does not occur within the continental United States and/or its territories.
- 5. Delete the 8th marketing claim. The Agency does not have any CSFs on file listing this fragrance.

Storage and Disposal Statement section comment(s):

6. To facilitate inclusion of language from PR Notice 2007-1, replace this section with:

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Pesticide Storage: Store this product away from open heat or flame in an area inaccessible to children.

Pesticide Disposal: Do not incinerate! **If empty:** Offer for recycling, if available. **If partly filled:** Call your local solid waste agency [or toll free number or website which meets the criteria in paragraph II.E., P.R. Harmful if swallowed. Do not get in eyes. Wear goggles, face shield or safety glasses. Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse."

Current labels on DEET repellent products tend to dissolve from contact with the repellent (usually liquids). All reregistered DEET product labels must use materials that remain permanent and readable for the reasonable life of the product. The Agency determined in the DEET RED document that all aerosol and pump spray formulations must be packaged in containers utilizing a concave trigger to help aim product or other comparable mechanism that will ensure that the product will not be inadvertently sprayed in the eyes.

The Agency is in the process of developing and improving the current Efficacy Assessment Guidelines for repellent products. The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, please be aware that the website becomes labeling under FIFRA and is subject to review by the Agency. If the website is false or misleading, the product would be misbranded and unlawful to sell or distribute under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR §156.10(a)(5) lists examples of statements EPA may consider false or misleading. In addition, regardless of whether a website is referenced on your product's label, claims made on the website may not be substantially differ from those claims approved through the registration process. Therefore, should the Agency find, or if it is brought to our attention that a website contains false or misleading statements or claims substantially differing

from the EPA-approved registration, the website will be referred to EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance (OECA). As an alternative, you may refer consumers to the company's phone number or e-mail address.

NOTE: This DEET product is not being re-registered under FIFRA section 4(g) at this time.

A copy of your label stamped "Accepted with Comments" is enclosed for your records. Please submit two (2) copies of the final printed labeling, incorporating the above changes, before releasing the product for shipment. If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing amended labeling constitutes accepting of these conditions.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

To repel the listed insects: Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Do not use under clothing. Avoid over application of this product. Frequent re-application and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness.

If used on the face: Spray on hands first and then apply sparingly and avoid eyes. Do not spray directly on face. Do not apply near eyes or mouth. Do not apply over cuts, wounds or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth. Apply sparingly around ears.

Do not apply to children's hands. Do not allow children to handle this product. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put on the child. Repeat as needed.

For ticks and chiggers, also apply to shoe tops, socks and around openings in clothing.
