For Control of Wasps and Hornets: It is preferable to apply this product in the evening after all insects have returned to the nest. Aim valve opening at the nest and depress button, continuing to spray until the nest is soaked with the spray. Treat the nests and remove them 48 hours after treatment, when all the wasps and hornets are dead.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Storage: Store in a cool dry area away from heat or open flame.

Do Not Puncture or Incinerate!

Container Disposal: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container.

If empty: Place in trash or offer for recycling if available.

If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions.
