Measure the tree at chest height in inches. If measuring the circumference of the tree, divide this number by six (6) to determine the number of capsules needed. If measuring the diameter of the tree (DBH), divide this number by two (2) to determine the number of capsules needed. It is preferred to apply the injector units around the tree at the root flare.

The following dosage, per capsule, is generally recommended depending on tree diameter:

2 ml capsules - 2 to 10 inches DBH

3 ml capsules - 10 to 36 inches DBH

4 ml capsules - 36 inches DBH and above.

For heavier infestation and/or more resistant insects, it is recommended that 3 mL capsules or 4mL capsules be used on trees having a DBH of 2 inches and above. Consult the enclosed pamphlet "Directions for Use and Application of Mauget Micro-Injection System" for additional instructions. Applicators shall remove capsules promptly after treatment. Trees in advanced stages of insect infestation may not respond to treatment. The health of the tree and the environmental conditions will determine the rate of uptake.
