Notification of Label Statements on EPA-Approved Supplemental Labeling

Dear Sir/Madam:

On September 30, 2003, EPA approved supplemental labeling for use of Poast® Herbicide (EPA Reg. No. 7969-58) in pistachio, safflower, lingongberry, juneberry and salal. A copy of the stamped label is attached for reference. The purpose of this notification is to include/modify the following pertinent information on this label:

1) The ingredient statement has been added to page 1.

- 2) Since BASF is not including the pistachio use on the supplemental label for commercial distribution, the statement "Poast should only be applied as a directed spray to the grove floor for bearing pistachio tress" has been removed.
- 3) The "Conditions of Sale and Warranty" section has been added on page 2, matching the same statements found on the EPA-approved master label for Poast...

Enclosed are one copy of amended supplemental labeling, reflecting the changes described above, and a completed EPA 8570-1 Registration Application form.

This notification is consistent with the provisions of PR Notice 98-10 and EPA regulations at 40 CFR 152.46, and no other changes have been made to the labeling of this product. I understand that it is a violation of 18 U.S.C. Sec. 1001 to willfully make any false statement to EPA. I further understand that if this notification is not consistent with the terms of PR Notice 98-10 and 40 CFR 152.46, this product may be in violation of FIFRA and I may be subject to enforcement action and penalties under section 12 and 14 of FIFRA.

All applicable directions, restrictions and precautions on the EPA-registered label are to be followed. This labeling must be in the possession of the user at the time of application.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. **DO NOT** apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application. For any requirements specific to your state or tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

Poast® herbicide may be applied to the crops listed in **Table 1**. Apply to actively growing grasses. In irrigated areas, it may be necessary to irrigate prior to treatment with **Poast** to ensure weeds are growing actively. See **Poast** label for complete list of annual and perennial grasses controlled with use of this herbicide.

Always adjust spray pressure, spray volume and height of spray boom to ensure thorough coverage of grasses to be controlled.

For maximum use rate per application and per season and for the minimum time from application to harvest, see **Table 1**.

II. RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

DO NOT plant other crops to be harvested for 30 days after application unless **Poast** is registered for use on that crop.

Avoid all direct or indirect contact with any desired grass crop unless otherwise recommended on the **Poast** label.

DO NOT apply to grasses or crops under stress such as stress due to lack of moisture, hail damage, flooding, herbicide injury, mechanical injury, or widely fluctuating temperatures, as unsatisfactory control may result. Irrigation may be needed.

DO NOT apply to crops that show injury (leaf phytoxicity or plant stunting) produced by any other prior herbicide applications, because this injury may be enhanced or prolonged.

Physical incompatibility, reduced weed control, or crop injury may result from mixing **Poast** with other pesticides (fungicides, herbicides, insecticides, or miticides), additives, or fertilizers. BASF does not recommend using tank mixes other than those listed on BASF labeling. Local agricultural authorities may be a source of information when using other than BASF recommended tank mixes.
