The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under section 3(C) (7) (A) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended is acceptable provided that you:

1. Submit or cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. Submit production information (pounds or gallons produced) for this product for the fiscal year in which uses on crambe, cuphea, echium, gold of pleasure, Hare's ear mustard, lesquerella, lunaria, meadowfoam, milkweed, mustared seed, oil radish, poppy, sesame, and sweet rocket are conditionally registered, in accordance with FIFRA section 29. The fiscal year begins October 1 and ends September 30. Product information will be submitted to the Agency no later than November 15, following the end of the preceding fiscal year.

3. Submit one (1) copy of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA Section 6 (e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the

amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

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A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

Supplemental labeling must be incorporated into master labeling and copies of master labeling submitted to the Agency for our files at your next printing or within two years from the date of acceptance of supplemental labeling, whichever comes first. The Agency will consider a convincing argument as to why a supplemental label should not appear on a master label on a case by case basis.

### Directions For Use

### GENERAL INFORMATION

Apply to actively growing grasses. In irrigated areas, it may be necessary to irrigate prior to treatment with **Poast<sup>®</sup> herbicide** to ensure weeds are growing actively. See **Poast** container label for complete list of annual and perennial grasses controlled with use of this herbicide.

Always adjust spray pressure, spray volume and height of spray boom to ensure thorough coverage of grasses to be controlled.

For maximum use rate per application and per season and for the minimum time from application to harvest, see **Table** on page 2.

### RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

**DO NOT** plant other crops to be harvested for 30 days after application unless **Poast** is registered for use on that crop.

Avoid all direct or indirect contact with any desired grass crop unless otherwise recommended on the **Poast** label.

**DO NOT** apply to grasses or crops under stress such as stress due to lack of moisture, hail damage, flooding, herbicide injury, mechanical injury, or widely fluctuating temperatures, as unsatisfactory control may result. Irrigation may be needed.

**DO NOT** apply to crops that show injury (leaf phytotoxicity or plant stunting) produced by any other prior herbicide applications, because this injury may be enhanced or prolonged.
