The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided you make the following revisions:

1. Add the company name and address to the front panel.
2. Revise the first paragraph under Hazards To Humans & Domestic Animals to read as follows:

"CAUTION: Causes eye and skin irritation. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. When mixing, loading or applying this product, wear long-sleeved shirt, long pants, socks, shoes and chemical-resistant gloves. After using this product, rinse gloves before removing, remove clothing and launder separately before reuse, and promptly and thoroughly wash hands and exposed skin with soap and water. Remove saturated clothing as soon as possible and shower."

3. Revise the Statement of Practical Treatment to read as follows:

IF SWALLOWED: Call a physician or Poison Control Center. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. If person is unconscious, do not give anything by mouth and do not induce vomiting.

IF ON SKIN: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

IF IN EYES: Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician if irritation persists."

If this container is over one gallon and less than five gallons, the person engaged in open pouring of this product must also wear coveralls or a chemical-resistant apron. If this container is five gallons or more in capacity, then a mechanical system (probe and pump) must be used for transferring the contents of this container. If the contents of a non-refillable pesticide container are emptied, the probe must be rinsed before removal.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to aquatic invertebrates. Drift or runoff may adversely affect aquatic invertebrates and nontarget plants. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift. Vapors from this product may injure susceptible plants in the immediate vicinity. Coarse sprays are less likely to drift. Most cases of groundwater contamination involving phenoxy herbicides such as 2,4-D have been associated with mixing/loading and disposal sites. Caution should be exercised when handling 2,4-D pesticides at such sites to prevent contamination of groundwater supplies. Use of a closed system for mixing or transferring this product will reduce the probability of spills. Placement of mixing/loading equipment on an impervious pad to contain spills will help prevent groundwater contamination.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Use 4 to 6 quarts per acre (3 to 5 ounces in 1-2 gallons water per 1,000 sq. ft.) in sufficient water for uniform spray coverage. Repeat applications may be necessary. Use lower rates for easy-to-kill species, i.e. dandelion and plantains. Use higher rate for more effective general control of weeds.

Use preferably in the spring or fall when weeds are actively growing. The killing action is more rapid when applied on warm clear sunny days than when the weather is cool, cloudy, or wet.

NOTE: Do not use on newly seeded lawns. Do not mow turf for several days before or after treatment. In some areas Dichondra, clover, bent grasses, carpet buffalo, and St. Augustine grasses may be injured.

This product will kill or seriously injure many desirable forms of vegetation. Do not apply directly to flowers, fruits, vegetables, grapes, ornamentals, cotton, or other desirable plants. Do not use when there is a hazard from drifting mists (coarse sprays are less likely to drift).

Vapors from this product may injure susceptible plants in the vicinity. Excessive amounts of this product in the soil may temporarily inhibit seed germination and plant growth.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, feed, or fertilizer by storage or disposal. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. If container is damaged or leaking, contain spill. Soak up spilled material with absorbent and place in closed, labeled container for proper disposal.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are toxic.
