DIRECTIONS

1. Remove most of the water from toilet bowl by pushing it down the drain with McNess Bowl Map.
2. Remove excess water from Bowl Map by pressing against side of bowl.
3. Holding bottle over bowl pour one ounce of McNess Bowl Cleaner on Bowl Map.
4. Mop entire inside of bowl, especially under rim where rust, lime and bacteria collect.
5. Flush and rinse out Bowl Map.

Do not use on sinks, bath tubs or other porcelain enameled surfaces. Use of this product on other than vitreous ware is done at user's risk. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and discard it.

External: Eyes: Wash with water for 15 minutes. Get prompt medical attention: **Skin:** Wipe off the acid gently, immediately flood the surface with water, using soap freely, then cover with moist magnesia or baking soda.

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
