**BONNET CLEANING:** Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix four (4) ounces of this product per gallon of water. Spray on carpet at rate of 200 - 300 sq. ft. per gallon.

#### HEAVY DUTY SPIN BONNET (BONNET BUFF) CLEANING:

Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix sixteen (16) ounces of this product per gallon of water. Spray on carpet at rate of 200 - 300 sq. ft. per gallon.
