STATEMENT OF PRATICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED: call a physician or Poison Control Center. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger, or if available, by administering syrup of ipecac. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
IF INHALED: remove to fresh air. If not breathing give artificial respiration preferably mouth to mouth. Get medical attention.
IF ON SKIN: immediately wash skin with plenty of soap and water.
IF IN EYES: flush with water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: 0.0.0.0 tetraethyl dithiopyrophosphate is an acetylcholinesterase inhibitor. Atropine is antidotal.

Store cans at room temperature away from boilers. Keep away from food or feed. Dispose of cans according to approved Federal, State or local procedures under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.
Pesticide, spray mixture or residue that cannot be used according to label instructions must be disposed of according to Federal, State or local procedures under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.

PROCEDURE

Close all doors, windows and ventilators tightly. Plug all hoses, cracks or openings in glass. Do not fumigate greenhouse if foliage of plants is wet. Turn off all misting systems. Keep humidity as low as possible. Maintain temperature of greenhouse between 70° and 80° F.

Place each smoke generator in the greenhouse walk upon a 1 in. brick or overturned clay flower pot. Keep generators at least 2 feet away from plants. **DANGER:** May cause fires. Do not place near combustible materials like plastics, wood shavings, sphagnum moss, etc. Shake can vigorously to fluff up or loosen the powder. Puncture both triangular marks as indicated on top side of can, using tool furnished. Tilt can sharply backwards to throw powder away from one of the punctured openings. Light one of the enclosed igniters at point nearest bare metal used to hold igniters being sure igniter is well lit. Insert burning lighter entirely inside the can through the opening and tilt can forward to level powder. Prompt ignition results. Place can on floor with punctured holes pointing lengthwise to the walk. Where the greenhouse being fumigated is large enough to require that generators be placed in more than one walk, it is recommended that one person be assigned to light the generators in each walk starting at the end farthest from the exit, so that the fumigation in each walk may start simultaneously and the persons exit from the house simultaneously.

The smoke generator will commence to smoke immediately and the dose will continue to be effective for several hours. It is recommended that the ventilators of the house be kept closed all night wherever possible, to secure maximum killing effect of this application. Lock or barricade all entrances and post with warning signs to prevent persons or animals from entering during treatment.

It is further recommended that the placards be put on all doors with the following statement: Danger. Keep away. Area treated with fumigant. For local and state laws for posting of such warning signs consult your state Agricultural Extension Service or Experimental Station.

Ventilate house thoroughly after fumigation for at least 2 hours before permitting work to be done there. Repeat fumigation every three days until greenhouse is absolutely clean and then fumigate as reinfestation appears.
