DIRECTIONS FOR USE

- To kill roaches & waterbugs:** Apply in all cracks and crevices in woodwork, underneath sinks, dark places, behind pipes, and in all places where roaches and waterbugs infest, contacting as many insects as possible. Repeat the operation as often as necessary.
- To kill bedbugs:** Spray bed frames, springs, mattress, tufts seams, and all cracks and hiding places about the bedroom, around baseboards, walls and floors. Allow mattress to dry before using.
- To kill flies, mosquitoes and gnats:** Close room and discharge spray mist vigorously in all parts of room, using about two or three ounces for each 1,000 cubic feet of space. Leave room closed for at least ten minutes. Repeat as needed.
- To kill ants:** Spray ant trails and center of ant hills, areas around door sills and window frames where the pests enter the premises
- To kill fleas (infesting premises):** Remove and destroy animal's bedding and spray sleeping quarters freely, forcing the spray into all cracks in the floor and about the room. Repeat when re-infested
- To kill clothes moths, carpet beetles:** Spray all articles to be protected, giving particular attention to folds and seams. Interior surfaces of storage containers such as closets, chest and trunks should be regularly sprayed. The treatment should be repeated every thirty days unless the articles are stored in a moth-tight container
- To kill grain weevils, Cadelles, grain moths, flour beetles and grain mites: (accessible stages):** Wet surfaces thoroughly and treat all infested surfaces, insect hiding places and insect runways at the rate of one gallon of this material on 750 square feet of area equivalent to spraying to point of run off. Repeat when necessary

CAUTION

Do not use near an open flame. Store in a cool place. Keep container tightly closed.
