Dear Ms. Larson:

The amended label referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable. This approval does not affect any conditions that were previously imposed on this registration. You continue to be subject to existing conditions on your registration and any deadlines connected with them.

A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. This labeling supersedes all previously accepted labeling. You must submit one copy of the final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the new labeling. In accordance with 40 CFR 152.130(c), you may distribute or sell this product under the previously approved labeling for 18 months from the date of this letter. After 18 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling. "To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR 152.3.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act and is subject to review by the Agency. If the website is false or misleading, the product would be misbranded and unlawful to sell or distribute under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR 156.10(a)(5) list examples of statements EPA may consider false or misleading. In addition, regardless of whether a website is referenced on your product's label, claims made on the website may not substantially differ from those claims approved through the registration process. Therefore, should the Agency find or if it is brought to our attention that a website contains false or misleading statements or claims substantially differing from the EPA approved registration, the website will be referred to the EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contact with skin or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet. Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact may cause allergic reactions in some individuals.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): Mixers and loaders involved in ground application must wear coveralls over long-sleeved shirt and long pants, shoes plus socks, chemical-resistant gloves made of Barrier Laminate, Nitrile Rubber, or Viton, and a minimum of a NIOSH approved filtering face piece respirator with any R or P filter (TC-

84A). You can also use other NIOSH approved particulate respirators that offer more protection such as a half face or full face respirator with any filter or a powered air purifying respirator with an HE filter. Applicators involved in ground ULV application must use an enclosed cab as described in the Engineering Controls section of this label and must wear long-sleeved shirt and long pants, and shoes plus socks. Aerial applicators and pilots must use an enclosed cockpit and wear long-sleeved shirt, long pants, shoes, and socks.

Engineering Controls: Ground applicators must use an enclosed cab that has a nonporous barrier that totally surrounds the occupants and prevents contact with pesticides outside the cab. Applicators must be provided and have immediately available for use in an emergency when they must exit the cab in the treated area: coveralls, chemical-resistant gloves made of Barrier Laminate, Nitrile Rubber, or Viton, and a respirator of the type specified in the PPE section of this labeling. Take off any PPE that was worn in the treated area before reentering the cab and store all such PPE in a chemical-resistant container, such as a plastic bag, to prevent contamination of the inside of the cab.

Mixers and loaders involved in aerial application must use a closed system designed by the manufacturer to enclose the pesticide to prevent it from contacting handlers or other people and which is used and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's written operating instructions. Mixers and loaders using a closed system must wear protective eyewear if the system operates under pressure, and must have immediately available for use in an emergency, such as a broken package, spill, or equipment breakdown coveralls, chemical-resistant gloves made of Barrier Laminate, Nitrile Rubber, or Viton, chemical-resistant footwear, chemical-resistant apron and a respirator of the type specified in the PPE section of this labeling.

User Safety Requirements: Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry. Discard clothing and other absorbent materials that have been drenched or heavily contaminated with this product's concentrate. Do not reuse them.

USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS: Users should wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet. Users should remove clothing/PPE immediately if pesticide gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing. Users should remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash thoroughly and change into clean clothing.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish, aquatic invertebrates, small mammals and birds. Runoff from treated areas or deposition of spray droplets into a body of water may be hazardous to fish and aquatic invertebrates. Do not apply over bodies of water (lakes, rivers, permanent streams, natural ponds, commercial fish ponds, swamps, marshes or estuaries), except when necessary to target areas where adult mosquitoes are present, and weather conditions will facilitate movement of applied material beyond the body of water in order to minimize incidental deposition into the water body. Do not contaminate bodies of water when disposing of equipment rinsate or wash waters.

This product is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment or residues on blooming crops or weeds. Do not apply this product or allow it to drift to blooming crops or weeds if bees are visiting the treatment area, except when applications are made to prevent or control a threat to public and/or animal health determined by a state, tribal or local health or vector control agency on the basis of documented evidence of disease causing agents in vector mosquitoes, or the occurrence of mosquito-borne disease in animal or human populations, or if specifically approved by the state or tribe during a natural disaster recovery effort.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Do not store near heat or open flame.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

For use only by federal, state, tribal or local government officials responsible for public health or vector control, or by persons certified in the appropriate category or otherwise authorized by the state or tribal lead pesticide regulatory agency to perform adult mosquito control applications, or by persons under their direct supervision.

Before making the first application in a season, it is advisable to consult with the state or tribal agency with primary responsibility for pesticide regulation to determine if other regulatory requirements exist.

MOSQUITOMIST 1.5 ULV is formulated for adult mosquito control as a thermal fog or as an ultra-low volume (ULV) nonthermal aerosol (cold fog) in outdoor residential, recreational, and other non-cropland areas where these insects are a problem. For best results treat when mosquitoes are most active and weather conditions are conducive to keeping the spray cloud close to the ground. An inversion of air temperatures and a light breeze are preferable. Application in calm air conditions is to be avoided. Apply only when ground wind speed is greater than 1 mph. Air temperatures should be greater than 50 F when conducting applications.

Do not treat a site with more than 0.01 pounds of chlorpyrifos per acre in a twenty-four hour period. Do not exceed 0.26 pounds of chlorpyrifos per acre per year. More frequent applications may be made to prevent or control a threat to public and/or animal health determined by a state, tribal, or local health or vector control agency on the basis of documented evidence of disease causing agents in vector mosquitoes or the occurrence of mosquito-borne disease in animal or human populations, or if specifically approved by the state or tribe during a natural disaster recovery effort.

Do not contaminate food or feed products. Do not allow spray treatment to drift onto places where bees are foraging, pastureland, cropland, poultry ranges or potable water supplies. Do not use on crops for food, forage or pasture. In treatment of corrals, feed lots, swine lots and zoos, cover any exposed drinking water, drinking water fountains and animal feed before application.

SPRAY DROPLET SIZE DETERMINATION

Ground-based Application: For application as an ultra low volume (ULV) nonthermal aerosol (cold fog) spray, equipment must be adjusted so that the volume median diameter (VMD) is between 8 and 30 microns ($8 \le Dv \ 0.5 \le 30$ um) and that 90% of the spray is contained in droplets smaller than 50 microns ($Dv \ 0.9 < 50$ um). Directions from the equipment manufacturer or vendor, pesticide registrant or a test facility using a laser-based measurement instrument must be used to adjust equipment to produce acceptable droplet size spectra. Application equipment must be tested at least annually to confirm that pressure at the nozzle and nozzle flow rate(s) are properly calibrated.

Aerial Application: Spray equipment must be adjusted so that the volume median diameter produced is less than 60 microns (Dv 0.5 < 60 um) and that 90% of the spray is contained in droplets smaller than 115 microns (Dv 0.9 < 115 um). The effects of flight speed and, for non-rotary nozzles, nozzle angle on the droplet size spectrum must be considered. Directions from the equipment manufacturer or vendor, pesticide registrant or a test facility using a wind tunnel and laser-based measurement instrument must be used to adjust equipment to produce acceptable droplet size spectra. Application equipment must be tested at least annually to confirm that pressure at the nozzle and nozzle flow rate(s) are properly calibrated.

GROUND ULV APPLICATION

Thermal Fog Application: To prepare a fog solution, thoroughly mix 6 gallons of MOSQUITOMIST 1.5 ULV in 94 gallons of No. 2 fuel oil or other fuel, diesel or kerosene-type oil suitable for insecticide and fogging use. Apply the finished fog solution with any standard thermal fog machine calibrated to deliver 52.5 gallons per hour at an average vehicle speed of 5 mph to cover a swath of up to 300 feet.

ULV Nonthermal Aerosol (Cold Fog) Application: Apply MOSQUITOMIST 1.5 ULV through standard ULV cold aerosol or non-thermal aerosol (Cold Fog) generators undiluted at a flow rate of 2.7 TO 5.3 fluid ounces per minute at an average vehicle speed of 10 mph. This is equivalent to 0.005 to 0.01 pounds of chlorpyrifos per acre based on an effective swath width of 300 feet. Under normal residential conditions a flow rate of 4.3 fluid ounces per minute is recommended. If a different vehicle speed is used, adjust rate accordingly. An accurate flow meter must be used to ensure the proper flow rate.

For proper application, mount the applicator so that the nozzle is at least 4 ½ feet above ground level and directed out the back of the vehicle. Failure to follow the above directions may result in reduced effectiveness and oversize spray droplets, which may deposit on and permanently damage automobile paint.

AERIAL APPLICATION

MOSQUITOMIST 1.5 ULV may be applied undiluted at rates up to 0.87 fluid ounces MOSQUITOMIST 1.5 ULV per acre (0.01 pounds of chlorpyrifos per acre) by fixed wing or rotary aircraft equipped with suitable ULV application equipment. Do not apply by fixed wing at a height less than 100 feet, or by helicopter at a height less than 75 feet unless specifically approved by the state or tribe based on public health needs.

IN FLORIDA: Aerial applications of this product require trained personnel to perform industry accepted assays to monitor resistance formation in targeted mosquitoes.

STORAGE & DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Pesticide Storage: Store in a dry and cool place away from food and feed. **Pesticide Disposal:** Pesticide, spray mixture or rinse water that cannot be used according to label instructions must be disposed of according to applicable Federal, State or local guidelines.

[Only one of the following two container handling instructions will appear on the label depending on container type.]

[Labeling for rigid, non-refillable containers with capacities greater than 5 gallons]

Container Handling: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse this container to hold materials other than pesticides or dilute pesticides (rinsate). After emptying and cleaning, it may be allowable to temporarily hold rinsate or other pesticide-related materials in the container. Contact your state regulatory agency to determine allowable practices in your state. Triple rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container ¹/₄ full mineral oil or fuel-type oil. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling if available or reconditioning if appropriate, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.

[Labeling for rigid, refillable containers with capacities greater than 5 gallons]

Container Handling: Refillable container. Refill this container with pesticide only. Do not reuse this container for any other purpose. Cleaning the container before final disposal is the responsibility of the person disposing of the container. Cleaning before refilling is the responsibility of the refiller. To clean the container before final disposal, empty the remaining contents from this container into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container about 10_percent full with water and, if possible, spray all sides while adding water. If practical, agitate vigorously or recirculate water with the pump for 2 minutes. Pour or pump rinsate into application equipment or rinsate collection system. Repeat this rinsing procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling if available or reconditioning if appropriate, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.
