The following amendment, submitted under connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with the conditions listed below:

Proposed Amendment

- Revised labeling

Conditions

Revise the label as follows:

- The term "biodegradable" is only acceptable when used in reference to a pesticide product's package or packaging and the registrant must certify that the package breaks down and provide information to support it. The term "biodegradable" may not be used on a pesticide label in any other context. Therefore, the term "biodegradable" must be deleted from the label text.



SANITIZER FOR DAIRY FARM TANKS AND MILKING MACHINE PARTS.

A. Clean milking machine parts.

1. Immediately after use, remove gross food particles and soil by a pre-flush, or pre-scrape and when necessary, pre-soak treatment.
2. Thoroughly wash the surface or objects with a good detergent or compatible cleaner followed by a potable water rinse prior to application of the sanitizing solution.

B. Sanitize with 1 oz. Webco Acid Sanitizer per 6 gal. water. This will provide 755 ppm of phosphoric acid.

1. Thoroughly wet surface or immerse for a period of at least one minute for sanitization.
2. Adequately drain surface or equipment and let air dry before reuse.
3. Mechanical operations, the prepared use solution may not be reused for sanitization but may be reused for other purposes such as cleaning.
4. Manual operations, prepare fresh solution daily or more often if the solution becomes diluted or soiled.

CONTACT TIME: The laws of some states require that utensils and equipment remain in contact with sanitizing solution for 2 minutes. Check with your Health Department.

This product contains only biodegradable surfactants and will not create foam problems in sewage systems, rivers or streams. Phosphorous content as (P), 18.3%. Recommended use solution (1 fl. oz. / 6 gal. water) contains 1.25 grams of phosphorous (as P) per gallon.
