2% CHLORDANE POISON BAIT

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

This material may be used to control crickets, grasshoppers and darkling ground beetles in the following crops.

Seedling stage only — Sugar Beets. Lettuce, Cabbage at the rate of 25 to 35 pounds per acre.

Cotton — 25 to 40 pounds per acre.

Scatter well in the field at the prescribed rates. Do not place in piles in the field. Apply after irrigation as the bait becomes ineffective after watering.

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed: Avoid breathing of dust. Don ot get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wash thoroughly. Avoid contamination of feed or foodstuffs.

Use a respirator acceptable to the Department of Agriculture for use when handling insecticides. Keep off skin as much as possible, washing off with soap and water without undue delay. Take precaution to keep off useful insecticides such as honeybees.
