Remove the incorrect requirement (if any) and add "Long-sleeved shirt and long pants." 

You have incorrect wording in the second-to-last sentence in the first paragraph in the Agricultural Use Requirements box on your proposed label. The sentence must be as follows: "It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted-entry interval."

Correct the typographical errors circled on your proposed label.

This reduction in mating will help suppress the larval (caterpillar) population which causes damage by feeding on the leaves of hardwoods and evergreens.

Note: Use of pheromones and limiting the use of conventional insecticides will help maintain the population of benefic: oarasites and predators. This can assist in biological control of gypsy moth and other pests, and therefo a complement pest management.

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

### AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers of farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification and emergency assistance. Using air or ground equipment apply, at least two weeks before adult gypsy moth emergence, 30-40 grams active ingredient per application per acre. Apply a second application if adult gypsy moth emergence is extended or delayed. An inert sticker material should be used with DISRUPT II Gypsy Moth to hold flakes on treated foliage or plant parts. The Hercon applicator equipment is specially designed to mix the proper amount of DISRUPT II Gypsy Moth flakes and the inert sticker at the time of application.

Use is such areas as forests; residential, municipal and shade tree areas; recreational areas such as campgrounds, golf courses, parks and parkways; ornamental, shade trees and forest nurseries; forest plantings; shelterbelts; and rights of way and other

Application must be done by or under the supervision of a qualified person to insure proper rate and method of application.

DISRUPT II Gypsy Moth can be used as a pest management tool by lowering the incidence of gypsy moth mating in low level populations. In areas of heavy infestation, DISRUPT II Gypsy Moth is recommended as a follow-up to larvicidal treatments as part of an Integrated Pest Management program.

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
