DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

E-Z Clor Big Tabs help prevent growth of algae, bacteria and fungi in swimming pools. Place tablet in plastic skimmer basket. Avoid metal objects.

1. Before using E-Z Clor Big Tabs for the first time, pool water should be stabilized with E-Z Clor Clear Stabilizer. Follow directions on the label for that product. Stabilizer increases the effective life of chlorine by reducing loss caused by the sun's rays. Add the stabilizer slowly to the pool's skimmer or filter in a bucket of hot water and add to the deep end of a pool. Do not backwash the filter for two days following a first method of application.
2. Then treat the pool with a shock dose of chlorinating compound, using a quickly soluble form such as E-Z Clor Quick Dissolve Concentrated Pool Chlorinating Compound. Follow directions on the label for that product. After several hours, check the chlorine residual to determine if at least 10 to 20 ppm has been obtained. If the chlorine residual is less than 10 to 20 ppm, repeat the shock dose until at least that level has been obtained.
3. Place one E-Z Clor Big Tab tablet in the pool's skimmer to provide daily chlorination. Add additional tablets if needed to maintain a chlorine residual of 10 to 20 ppm as determined by a suitable test kit. Give a shock dose (see item 2 above) whenever algae first becomes visible.

Keep pH of water between 7.2-7.6. Use an E-Z Clor test kit for accurate chlorine and pH control.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER: Highly corrosive. Causes skin and eye damage. May be fatal if swallowed. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wear goggles or face shield and rubber gloves when handling. Breathing to nose and mouth. Avoid breathing dust. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

PRACTICAL TREATMENT—FIRST AID: If swallowed, feed bread soaked in milk followed by olive oil or cooking oil. Call physician immediately. If on the skin: Wash off excess chemical and flush skin with cold water for at least 15 minutes. If in eyes: Flush with cold water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This product is toxic to fish. Do not discharge in lakes, streams, ponds or public waters unless in accordance with an NPDES Permit. For guidance, contact the regional office of EPA.

PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL HAZARDS: STRONG OXIDIZING AGENT. Strong Oxidizing Agent. Mix only with water. Use clean, dry utensils. Do not add the product to any dispersing device containing remnants of any other product. Such use may cause a violent reaction leading to fire or explosion. Contamination with moisture, organic material, or other chemicals may start a chemical reaction, with generation of heat, liberation of hazardous gases, and possible generation of fire and explosion. In case of contamination or decomposition, do not reuse container if possible, notify container in open air or well ventilated area. Flood with large volumes of water, if necessary.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Keep container tightly closed. Store in a dry place. Do not allow water to get into container. Keep container off wet floors. Do not contaminate water fountains or fountains by storage or disposal.

DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture or preparation is a violation of Federal Law.
