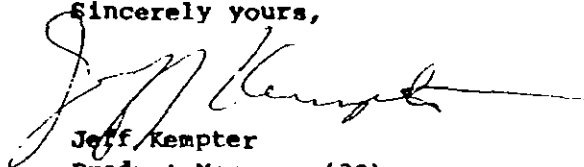

GENERAL INFORMATION

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with labeling.

This product is effective as a pool water disinfecting agent when used as directed. It is recommended that the pool be stabilized with E-Z Chlor Chlor-Save to nullify the dissipating effect of sunlight on chlorine. When using this product, both chlorine and cyanuric acid stabilizer are being added to the water; however, it is necessary to initially stabilize pool with E-Z Chlor Chlor-Save to effectively maintain the desired concentration of stabilizer. Follow the directions on the label for that product.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

The filter system should be backwashed or properly cleaned and the pH adjusted between 7.2 and 7.6. Before using this product, it is necessary that the pool be synchronized so that a free chlorine residual of between 1.0 and 3.0 ppm is obtained.

These sticks may be used in various type skimmers, floaters, proportioning mechanisms or feeders. Adjust whatever feeding mechanism that might be used to assure consistent treatment level of 1.0 to 2.0 ppm free available chlorine in the pool water (normally 1/2 lbs of this product per 10,000 gallons daily).

The regular use of a free chlorine test kit will determine if further adjustment may be necessary to maintain the recommended level of free available chlorine in the pool water.

A shock treatment should be made every week during hot weather or after heavy rain. Less frequent shock treatments may be made during cool weather. For the shock treatment, add an E-Z Chlor shock treatment product according to the label directions for that product. Swimmers should not be permitted in the pool after the shock treatment until the chlorine residual is below 3.0 ppm.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER: Highly corrosive. Causes skin and eye damage. May be fatal if swallowed. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Wear goggles or face shield and rubber gloves when handling. Irritating to nose and throat. Avoid breathing dust. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

PRACTICAL TREATMENT—FIRST AID: If swallowed, feed bread soaked in milk, followed by olive oil or cooking oil. Call physician immediately. If on the skin, brush off excess chemical and flush skin with cold water for at least 15 minutes. If in eyes, flush with cold water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This product is toxic to fish. Do not discharge into lakes, streams, ponds or public waters unless in accordance with an NPDES Permit. For guidance, contact the regional office of EPA.

PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL HAZARDS: STRONG OXIDIZING AGENT: Strong Oxidizing Agent. Mix only with water. Use clean, dry utensils. Do not add this product to any dispensing device containing remnants of any other product. Such use may cause a violent reaction leading to fire or explosion. Contamination with moisture, organic matter, or other chemicals may start a chemical reaction, with generation of heat, liberation of hazardous gases, and possible generation of fire and explosion. In case of contamination or decomposition, do not reuse container if possible, isolate container in open area or well ventilated area. Flood with large volumes of water if necessary.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Keep container tightly closed. Store in a dry place. Do not allow water to get into container. Keep container off the ground. Do not contain water, food, or other by storage or disposal.

DISPOSAL: Wastes of this pesticide may cause irreversible eye damage and burns to skin and may be dangerous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide spray mixture or residue is a violation of Federal law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by user according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Completely empty container of contents including cling-on particles. Rinse empty container with water and dispose of in a sanitary landfill or by incineration if allowed by State and local authorities.
