## PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

**DANGER:** Convulsive poison! May be fatal if swallowed. Do not breathe dust. Use rubber gloves when dispensing. Keep away from children, pets and domestic animals. Do not contaminate food and foodstuffs.

**STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT:** IF SWALLOWED, if less than ten (10) minutes has passed since the poison was taken, induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Then give milk or water and keep him warm and quiet. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth if more than ten (10) minutes has passed. Get medical attention.

**ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS:** This product is toxic to fish, birds and wildlife. Do not allow treated bait to be exposed to water. Keep out of lakes and streams or ponds. Do not contaminate water. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

**DIRECTIONS FOR USE:** It is a violation of Federal law to use this product inconsistent with its labeling. **HAND BAITING:** Pocket gophers usually throw out low fan-shaped mounds of dirt. The lateral opening may be open or plugged. With a shovel and a long-handled spoon, open the lateral opening. Insert a teaspoonful of 'This is the WAY Milo Bait' into the opening without covering bait. Several ounces to about 4 pounds of bait per acre may be needed depending on gopher population. **MACHINE BAITING:** Adjust burrow machine to operate at average depth of existing hole. A size heap of 'This is the WAY Milo Bait for Pocket Gophers' is deposited at about 10 inches that each pocket gopher will receive a toxic dose at each bait placement. Artificially created active pocket gopher areas. From 1 to 5 pounds of bait per acre may be needed depending on gopher population.

**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL:** **PROHIBITIONS:** Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. **PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticide, spray mixture or residue that cannot be used or stored in a tank or container approved for pesticides or buried in a safe place away from water. **CONTAINER DISPOSAL:** Dispose of in an incinerator or landfill approved for pesticides. **GENERAL:** Consult federal, state or local disposal authorities for approved alternate disposal methods.

**DANGER:** Convulsive poison! May be fatal if swallowed. Do not breathe dust. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Use rubber gloves when dispensing. Keep away from children, pets and domestic animals and away from where this might be mistaken for regular grain. Do not contaminate food and foodstuffs.

### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED, if less than ten (10) minutes has passed since the poison was taken, drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Have patient lie down in quiet, darkened room and keep him warm and quiet. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention.

### ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish, birds and wildlife. Do not allow treated bait to be exposed above the ground. Clean up spilled bait immediately. Keep out of lakes and streams or ponds. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

### DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product inconsistent with its labeling.

**HAND BAITING:** Pocket gophers usually throw out low fan-shaped mounds of dirt from a lateral branch of their main burrow. The lateral opening may be open or plugged. With a shovel and a long-handled spoon carefully clean out lateral down to the junction with the main burrow. Insert a teaspoonful of 'This is the WAY Milo Bait for Pocket Gophers' at the junction. Close opening without covering bait. Several ounces to about 4 pounds of bait per acre may be needed depending on pocket gopher population.

**MACHINE BAITING:** Adjust burrow machine to operate at average depth of existing burrows and that at least a teaspoonful size heap of 'This is the WAY Milo Bait for Pocket Gophers' is deposited at about 10 foot intervals in the artificial burrows so that each pocket gopher will receive a toxic dose at each bait placement. Artificial burrows should be about 10 feet apart in active pocket gopher areas. From 1 to 5 pounds of bait per acre may be needed depending on pocket gopher population.

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

**PROHIBITIONS:** Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited.

**PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticide, spray mixture or residue that cannot be used or chemically reprocessed should be disposed of in a landfill approved for pesticides or buried in a safe place away from water supplies.

**CONTAINER DISPOSAL:** Dispose of in an incinerator or landfill approved for pesticide containers or bury in a safe place.

**GENERAL:** Consult federal, state or local disposal authorities for approved alternative procedures such as limited open burning.
