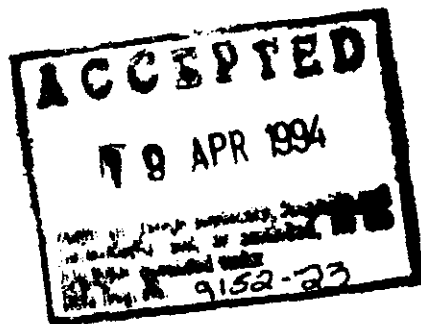

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If in eyes: Hold eyelids open and flush with a steady stream of water for 15 minutes. CALL A PHYSICIAN.
If swallowed: Drink promptly a large quantity of milk, egg white, gelatin solution, or, if not available, large quantities of water. AVOID ALCOHOL. If on skin: Wash with plenty of soap and water.

NOTE TO PHYSICIANS:

Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

SPILL OR LEAK

Contain spill/leak. Place in a appropriate chemical waste container. Flush spill area with water. Observe all local, state and federal laws and regulations regarding disposal, spill, cleanup, removal or discharge.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

DO NOT CONTAMINATE WATER, FOOD, OR FEED BY STORAGE OR DISPOSAL.
STORAGE: Store in a dry place no lower in temperature than 50°F, or higher than 120°F.
CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Do not reuse empty container. Triple rinse empty container with water. Return metal drum than offer for reconditioning or puncture and dispose of it in a sanitary, or by other procedures approved by State and local authorities. Plastic container may be disposed of in a sanitary landfill, incinerated or, if allowed by local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray or mixture of rinsate is a violation of Federal Law.
