DIRECTIONS

Initial Application: To a cleaned pool add one quart to 62,500 gallons of water, or ratio thereof.

Maintenance Dose: Use 8 oz. per 62,500 gallons of water every 5 to 7 days. When weather is hot or bathing load is heavy, use this dosage every 5 days or as necessary.

Booster Dose: Immediately after every rain add 8 oz. per 62,500 gallons of water as above.

Important: Follow above directions without fail, even when pool is not used. Algae growth must be fought at all times.

Pool-side surfaces: After cleaning surfaces, use ¼ oz. to five gallons of water for sanitizing or ½ oz. to 5 gallons of water for disinfecting.

DANGER

KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN

Corrosive. Causes severe eye and skin damage. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Wear goggles or face shield and rubber gloves when handling. Harmful or fatal if swallowed. Avoid contamination of food.

Do not re-use container. Destroy when empty.

This product is toxic to fish. Do not discharge pool water into lakes, streams, or ponds.

FIRST AID

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes, call a physician. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. If swallowed, drink promptly a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution; or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Call a physician immediately.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage. Measures against circulatory shock as well as oxygen and measures to support breathing manually or mechanically may be needed. If persistent, convulsions may be controlled by the cautious intravenous injections of a short-acting barbiturate drug.
