DIRECTIONS FOR USE

When preparing sanitizing solution, allow 15 minutes for tablets to dissolve in water before using for sanitizing dishes, glasses, utensils in restaurants, taverns, etc.

- 1 - Scrape and brush off food and grease as far as possible.
- 2 - Wash with a good detergent or commercial cleaner in first sink compartment.
- 3 - Rinse with clean water in second sink.
- 4 - Sanitize in a solution of 1 TABLET PER GALLON (250 ppm) in third sink compartment. Immerse all utensils for at least two minutes or for contact time specified by your sanitary code.
- 5 - Place sanitized utensils on a rack or towel to air dry.
- 6 - Final sanitizing solutions of 100 ppm may be safely used on food processing equipment and on other food contact articles specified under subpart E of the Food and Drug Act of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act.

Disposal

Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and discard.

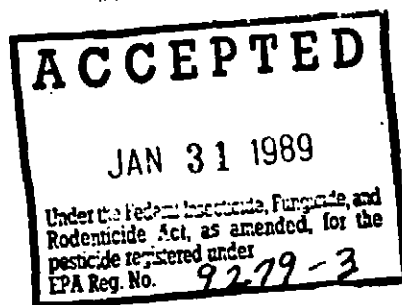
