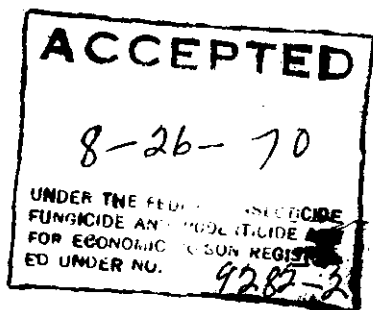

The user assumes all risk of use or handling of APICIDE whether or not in accordance with directions or suggestions.

DIRECTIONS

Locate the brood nest, or center of the colony, if possible by listening with your ear to the wall (inside or out). Where the buzzing and clicking sound is the loudest is generally the area of the brood comb and bees.

Drill a 1/4" hole into that section of the wall from either the inside or outside and push the bit on through to clear a hole into the brood area.

Insert the nozzle of the APICIDE dispenser into the 1/4" hole and squeeze the dispenser, thus pumping the dust into the brood area. Continue squeezing until most of the insecticide dust is pumped into the wall cavity. If dust packs in nozzle, remove dispenser and shake to loosen dust. Allow 24 hours for APICIDE to completely destroy the colony after which the 1/4" hole and the outside bee entrance can be permanently sealed with wood putty or some other similar impervious material.

If it is impossible to drill a hole into the brood nest, apply APICIDE heavily around the outside entrance to the colony. Also, pump a large quantity of APICIDE into the entrance. This method will take longer to destroy the colony and may require two or three applications in order to do so.

APICIDE will also destroy wasps and hornets but heavy protective clothing including veil and gloves should be worn in applying APICIDE to the nest, as the hornets will attack savagely before the APICIDE can be applied effectively.

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. **KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.** Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water after using. Stand upwind while pumping APICIDE into the entrance of the colony. **Do not eat any honey taken out of the wall after bees have been destroyed with APICIDE.** Empty container should be destroyed by burning (outdoors) or burying a foot deep.
