IMPORTANT STATEMENT

New Purge Concentrated Aerosol Insect Killer contains a highly effective insecticide formulation specially designed for use in automatic mist dispensing units against houseflies, gnats, beetles, flies, mosquitoes, and other areas where flies, gnats, flying moths, mosquitoes are an annoyance.

ACTIVE INGREDIENTS:

DIRECTIONS

When properly installed — one automatic mist dispensing unit containing a can of Purge Concentrated Aerosol Insect Killer is usually sufficient to treat 6,000 cubic feet of air space. The automatic sprayer will release 600 mg. of concentrated material every 10 minutes. Its effectiveness on flying insects will usually be noticeable within one hour after the machine has been activated. Two hours of continuous operation will generally suspend enough insecticide in the air to reduce the number of flying insects present on the premises. Maximum insect control is maintained when the automatic mist dispensing unit is allowed to run continuously for 24 hours per day. If less than 24 hours of operation per day is desired — the machine should then be set to start at least one hour before effective insect control is required and allowed to run continuously until control is no longer required.

FOR USE IN DISPENSING: One automatic unit should be installed for each 6,000 cubic feet of space to be treated. The automatic sprayer should be set to operate every 10 minutes. After 24 hours of operation, enough Purge is suspended in the air to kill a substantial proportion of the flies, mosquitoes and gnats present.

Usually, the effectiveness of Purge should be noticeable within one hour after the Automizer is activated. If less than 24 hours control is required, the Automizer should be set to start one hour before control is desired and run one hour after control is no longer needed.

Keep in mind that such factors as air flow rate, size of space treated, humidity and room temperature all affect insect activity and control. Therefore, one unit per 6,000 cubic feet should be considered as an average need with adjustments made depending on specific conditions of place of usage. As with any method of insect control, best results are achieved when sanitation and other positive insect-prevention practices are followed.

This 12-oz. can of Purge contains approximately 2.5 lbs. of active ingredient to sustain operation for a total of 600 hours or 60 days.

on a 24-hour basis. It is suggested that the container be changed once every 2 months.

CAUTION: Large drafts of forced ventilation may reduce or eliminate the insecticidal efficacy of these installations. Use the product as a space spray in food processing plants only when plant is not in operation. Foods should be removed or covered during treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered or thoroughly cleaned before using.
