
Subject: PURGE Air Sanitizer

Re-submissions Dated 8/25/03 and 10/30/03

The re-submissions referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, to provide a revised label which changes the "First Aid" statements as required per PR Notice 2001-1, and which makes other changes required in the EPA letter dated 10/19/03, are acceptable providing you submit three copies of a final printed label which makes the following minor label changes.

1. Correct "with spray heat beneath actuator" to "with spray head beneath actuator".
2. Delete the claim "Authorized by USDA for use in federally Inspected Meat and Poultry Plants". The EPA does not allow claims of endorsement by other Federal agencies. This claim has been blacked-out on the attached stamped copy which supercedes all prior label versions.
3. In the "Directions For Use", delete the word "highly" (implies heightened efficacy) from "highly effective". This word has been blacked out on the attached label.

A copy of the label (version R3EPAA19), stamped "Accepted with comments" is attached. This label supercedes all prior accepted label versions. Please include a copy of this letter with your final printed labels. 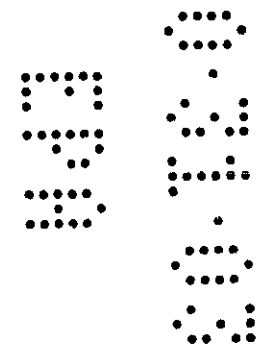

FIRST AID

If Swallowed: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

If Inhaled: Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably by mouth-to-mouth, if possible. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.

If on Skin or Clothing: Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

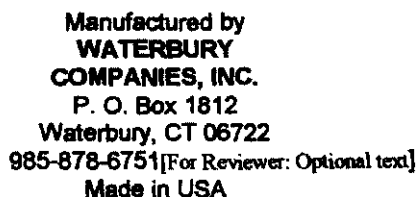
Have the product container or label with you when calling a poison control center or doctor, or going for treatment.

Physical or Chemical Hazards: Contents under pressure. Do not puncture. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Exposure to temperatures above 130°F may cause bursting. Never throw container into fire or incinerator.

[Product Name] is a ~~very~~ effective formulation specially designed for use in the timed, intermittent aerosol dispensing unit for the reduction of air-borne bacteria which can cause undesirable odors. Recommended for use in lobbies, reception rooms, locker rooms, rest rooms of hospitals, theaters or shops. Remove cap from can and place in sequential aerosol dispenser with spray head beneath actuator, nozzle facing front. Factors such as air currents, temperature, humidity and conformation of treated area govern number of units required for effective control. One unit should normally treat 6,000 cubic feet of closed air space. Dispenser location should be at a height of 8 feet and directed compatibly to air currents in closed areas. One can, used on a 24-hour basis, will provide adequate air sanitizing.

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage and disposal.
Storage: Store in a cool dry place away from heat or open flame.
Disposal: Do not Puncture or Incinerate! **If empty:** Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. **If partly filled:** Call your local solid waste agency or 1800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions.

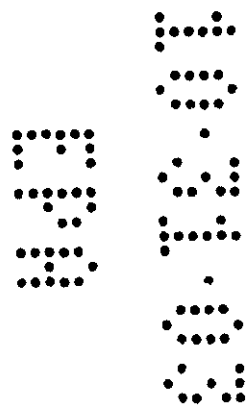
