USE DIRECTIONS:

Use 1-1/4 ounces per 100 pounds of S/S 90 in the FINAL RINSE CYCLE.

FIRST AID:

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes call a physician. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before re-use. If swallowed, drink promptly large quantities of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Call a physician immediately.

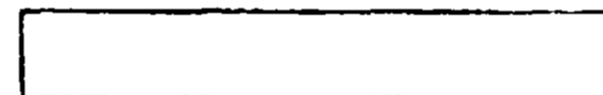
NOTE TO PHYSICIAN:

Probable mucousal damage may contraindicate use of gastric lavage. Measures against circulatory shock as well as oxygen and measures to support breathing manually or mechanically may be needed. If persistent, convulsions may be controlled by the cautious intravenous injection of a short acting barbiturate drug.
