FEEDING DIRECTIONS:
Supply this medicated block at the rate of 1 to 12 blocks per 100 head every 15 days. Cattle will consume 10 to 20 ounces per head daily. The above recommended feeding will insure the proper levels of Phenothiazine for maximum protection against horn flies. It is desirable to spray cattle before starting the program. This feed will prevent the breeding of horn flies in the manure, but does not kill any existing horn flies.
Since horn flies migrate from manure to manure, it is essential that the manure be piled up and covered with a layer of soil to prevent the migration of horn flies to other pastures.
