Your Amendment Dated September 21, 1990

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:
 - a. Change "GENERAL DISINFECTANT, SANITIZATION AND DEODORIZATION IN PUBLIC ROOMS AND AT HOME" to read "GENERAL DISINFECTION AND DEODORIZATION IN PUBLIC ROOMS AND AT HOME."
 - b. Delete the statement "For sanitizing, use a solution of one ounce to two gallons of water."
 - c. Change "DISINFECTION AND DEODORIZATION IN HOSPITALS" to read "DISINFECTION AND DEODORIZATION IN HOSPITALS (NON-MEDICAL USE AREAS):"
 - d. Under the "DISINFECTION AND DEODORIZATION IN HOSPITALS" heading, include the necessity for removal of gross filth or heavy soil prior to application of the product, method(s) of application, and contact time necessary for effectiveness. Refer to items 3, 5, and 6 of the DIS/TSS-15 enclosure.

- e. The Directions for Disinfection of Barber Shop and Beauty Parlor Equipment must also indicate if, and how, the product should be removed from the surfaces after the recommended exposure period. Refer to item 6 of the DIS/TSS-15 enclosure.
 - f. Revise "Causes severe eye damage" to read "Corrosive. Causes eye damage and skin irritation."
2. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A stamped copy of the labeling is enclosed for your records.

IT IS A VIOLATION OF FEDERAL LAW TO USE THIS PRODUCT IN A MANNER INCONSISTENT WITH ITS LABELING.

CLEANS AND DISINFECTS IN ONE OPERATION

DISINFECTION AND DEODORIZATION IN HOSPITALS. For disinfection and deodorization of walls, floors and other non-porous surface use 2 ounces of DGD in one gallon of water. For disinfection of porous and heavily contaminated surfaces, use four ounces of DGD to one gallon of water.

DISINFECTION OF BARBER SHOP AND BEAUTY PARLOR EQUIPMENT. Clean thoroughly, then soak combs, brushes, razors, etc. for ten minutes in a solution of two ounces of DGD to one gallon of water.

MOLD CONTROL. Clean surfaces thoroughly, rinse, spray or sponge with a solution containing 2 ounces of DGD in 1 gallon of water.
