

**DIRECTIONS**

PILES... Use 1 part Malathion 57 with 50 parts deodorized kerosene or water to prepare sprays. Spray in and around buildings which house domestic animals, around yards and houses, on fences, piles and garbage cans. Do not use in dwellings and remove livestock from buildings before spraying interior. Repeat application as required.

HOUSEHOLD INSECTS... ROACHES, ALTS, CRICKETS, SPIDERS, SILVERFISH.... Prepare a spray by mixing 1 part Malathion 57 to 50 parts water or deodorized kerosene. Apply by means of a coarse spray, or paint brush to window sills, baseboards, drainboards, under sinks, stoves, cracks and crevices, and to other areas frequented by insects. Avoid contamination of food, utensils, milk equipment, and water. Repeat application as necessary.

PILES... For control of adult mosquitoes on pasture and range land and in uncultivated lands, apply Malathion 57 at the rate of 1 to 16 pints per acre in a suitable carrier (water or oil) with a mist blower, ground fogger, or aircraft. Repeat application as necessary. Contamination of fish bearing waters at a rate of application of 1 cubic pints per acre will kill fish.

NOTICE TO PHYSICIANS... MALATHION upon repeated, prolonged, careless use, may cause cholinesterase inhibition. Atropine is antidotal.

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DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

To Kill Flies, Mosquitoes, Wasps and  
Flying Moths Outdoors: ~~WIL~~ - OUTDOORS

Dilute one pint WILD with water to make one gallon. For outdoors use only as an aid in reducing annoyance from these insects. Spray outside surfaces of screens, doors or windows or wherever these Insects may enter the room. Also treat surfaces around light fixtures on porches, in garages and other places where these insects alight or congregate.

Dilute one pint WILD with water to make one gallon. For treatment of localized infestations of these insects in outdoor areas where there is no vegetation. Spray infested areas thoroughly.
