APPLICATION IN HOSPITALS, RESTAURANTS, HOMES, AND PUBLIC ROOMS. This product may be used on floors, walls, woodwork, bed frames, linings, and equipment. Types of surfaces suitable for disinfection include glass, smooth metal, washable wood or metal, vinyl, glazed porcelain, plastic, leather, finished wood and similar non-porous, smooth surfaces.

Pre-clean surfaces with a suitable detergent and rinse with water before disinfection. After cleaning, use solution containing 1 ounce of Disinfectant per gallon of water for usual disinfecting applications. For highly contagious disease areas, use 1 1/2 ounces per gallon of water.

PRACTICAL TREATMENT (FIRST AID). In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes, call a physician. SANITIZATION OF FOOD CONTACT SURFACES, GLASSWARE, SILVERWARE, DISHES, COOKING UTENSILS, MILK CANS, AND EQUIPMENT IN FOOD PROCESSING PLANTS, MEAT PLANTS, DAIRIES, AND RESTAURANTS.

Scrape or flush away gross soils and clean with a suitable detergent. Rinse thoroughly with potable water, then apply a sanitizing treatment of 1 ounce of THIS PRODUCT in 4 gallons of water (200 ppm active sanitizer). The sanitizing treatment may be applied by immersion, flooding, flushing, spraying or with a clean cloth or mop. All surfaces must be thoroughly wet for 1-2 minutes for proper sanitization. Allow treated items to drain thoroughly and air dry. Do not use a towel. No rinsing is required. Where possible, invert treated items (glassware, dishes, utensils, milk cans, etc.) and let them drain and air dry on a clean surface. Prepare fresh solutions daily or more often if solutions become diluted or soiled.

FLANK AND UDDER WASHING. Use 1 ounce of Disinfectant per 4 gallons of water. Use a separate clean towel for each cow. Never dip a used towel back into the disinfectant solution. Prepare a fresh solution for each milking. Prepare solution in non-corrodible containers (stainless steel, plastic). Discard solutions if they become visibly soiled or turbid. To prevent residues in milk, allow udder to air dry or dry with clean towel before attaching to milker.

FOR DEODORIZING GARBAGE CANS, GARBAGE TRUCKS, INDUSTRIAL WASTE RECEPTACLES, AND GARBAGE HANDLING EQUIPMENT — Pre-clean with a suitable detergent and rinse well. Then, apply a wetting solution of 2 oz. of THIS PRODUCT per gallon of water.


