### DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its label.

This is a specially formulated, non-selective herbicide for controlling a wide variety of annual and perennial weeds and grasses. It is recommended for use only on non-cropland areas such as railroad rights-of-way, fence rows, parking lots, around buildings, loading ramps, storage yards, tank farms and industrial sites. The degree of control and duration of results depends on the amount of herbicide applied, soil type, rainfall and other conditions. This product is also highly recommended for municipal weed control and as a semi soil sterilant.

To control most weeds and grasses on non-cropland areas for an extended time, apply 1 gallon per 1000 square feet (43.5 gallons per acre) of undiluted weed killer after the most predominant weeds have emerged. No agitation is required. This herbicide should be applied with standard spraying equipment. For treating small areas, a tank type sprayer or sprinkling can may be used.

Use of this product in certain portions of California, Oregon and Washington is subject to the January 22, 2004 Order for injunctive relief in Washington Toxics Coalition, et al v. EPA, CO1-0132C, (W.D. WA). For further information, please refer to EPA Web Site: <http://www.epa.gov/espp>.

**Application Restrictions:** Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application.

Not to be used in any recreational areas or in or around homes.

**Entry Restrictions:** Do not enter or allow people (or pets) to enter the treated area until sprays have dried.

Prohibited for aerial applications.

**Spray Drift Management:** A variety of factors including weather conditions (e.g., wind directions, wind speed, temperature, relative humidity) and method of application (e.g., ground, airblast, chemigation) can influence pesticide drift. The applicator must evaluate all factors and make appropriate adjustments when applying the product.

**Droplet Size:** When applying sprays that contain 2,4-D as the sole active ingredient, or when applying sprays that contain 2,4-D mixed with active ingredients that require a coarse or coarser spray, apply only as a coarse or coarser spray (ASAE standard 572) or a volume mean diameter of 385 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles.

When applying sprays that contain 2,4-D mixed with other active ingredients that require a medium or more fine spray, apply only as a medium or coarser spray (ASAE standard 572) or a volume mean diameter of 300 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles.

**Wind Speed:** Do not apply at wind speeds greater than 15 mph. Only apply this product if the wind direction favors on-target deposition and there are not sensitive areas (including, but not limited to, residential areas, bodies of water, known habitat for nontarget species, nontarget crops) within 250 feet downwind. If applying a medium spray, leave one swath unsprayed at the downwind edge of the treated field.

**Temperature Inversions:** If applying at wind speeds less than 3 mph, the applicator must determine if: a) conditions of temperature inversion exist, or b) stable atmospheric conditions exist at or below nozzle height. Do not make applications into areas of temperature inversions or stable atmospheric conditions.

**Susceptible Plants:** Do not apply under circumstances where spray drift may occur to food, forage, or other plantings that might be damaged or crops thereof rendered unfit for sale, use or consumption. Susceptible crops include, but are not limited to, cotton, okra, flowers, grapes (in growing stage), fruit trees (foliage), soybeans (vegetative stage), ornamentals, sunflowers, tomatoes, beans, and other vegetables, or tobacco. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill container 1/4 full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times.

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
