

USE RESTRICTIONS

- Do not contaminate food or feedstuffs.
- This product is for indoor use only.
- This product is not for use in outdoor residential misting systems (indoor or outdoor), indoor metered devices, or indoor misting systems.
- Do not use in aircraft cabins.
- Do not apply this product directly to companion animals (pets).

TO KILL FLIES, GNATS, MOSQUITOES AND SMALL FLYING MOTHS: Close all doors and windows and direct spray upward into center of room with slow, sweeping motion. Spray 5 - 10 seconds for average room. Keep room closed for 15 minutes after spraying. Sweep up and discard fallen insects. Before spraying, cover exposed food and utensils.

TO KILL ANTS, CENTIPEDES, COCKROACHES, CRICKETS, FIREBRATS, SOUVIUS AND SPIDERS: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray in addition to thoroughly spraying all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators, food storage areas and wherever these pests are suspected of hiding. To kill ants, treat doors, ant trails, around window frames, and other areas of entry. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL CARPET BEETLES: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be sprayed thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture, and wherever these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL EXPOSED FORMS OF CONFUSED FLOUR BEETLES, RICE WEEVILS, AND SAWTOOTHED GRAIN BEETLES: Find and destroy infested packaged goods. Remove all other items from pantry. Spray the shelves to kill any of the named insects present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL FLEAS AND TICKS IN PET BEDDING AND PET AREAS: Remove and destroy pet's old bedding. To reduce infestation, thorough ly spray the animal's bedding, sleeping quarters, around baseboards, window and door frames, wall cracks, local areas of floors, and other resting places until the surface is slightly moist. Treat these areas at the rate of 2 seconds per linear foot at a distance of 12 to 18 inches. Also spray the entire inside surface of dog houses. Repeat as necessary. Put fresh bedding in pet's quarters after spray has dried. DO NOT SPRAY ANIMALS. Also treat dogs and cats with a registered flea and tick control product before allowing them to re-enter treated area.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.
PESTICIDE STORAGE: Do not store near heat or open flame. Store in a cool, dry (preferably locked) area that is inaccessible to children and animals.
