These statements are not required by the labeling quidance developed as "Appendix B" to the Strychnine Settlement agreement of 1989, and their use presents some significant problems. "CAUTION" is a direct contradiction of the signal word ("DAMSER") currently required for this product. "BIRDS FFEDING ON TREATED AREAS MAY BE KILLED" can be misinterpreted. In the context of this statement, "MAY" is intended to express a possibility to be avoided. However, "MAY" also implies granting permission -- a meaning opposite to that intended by the originators of the statement.

Acceptance of the label that you submitted on April 29, 1994, is granted only for the administrative purpose of bringing the labeling for 10140-5 into compliance with PR Notices 93-1, 93-3, and 93-8. As the U.S. District Court's injunction against above—ground uses of Strychnine remains in effect, it still is illegal to sell, otherwise distribute, or use this product in the U.S. If the injuction is lifted in the future, it is likely that the "ENDANGERED SPECIES" statements required for this product will change.

The Confidential Statement of Formula dated November 26, 1993, is generally acceptable, but one of the two sources of Strychnine Alkaloid listed is obsolete.
