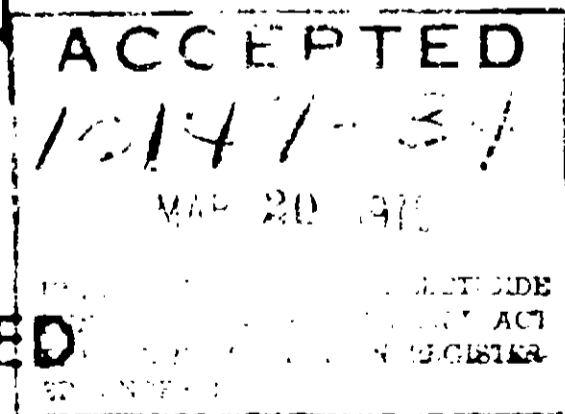

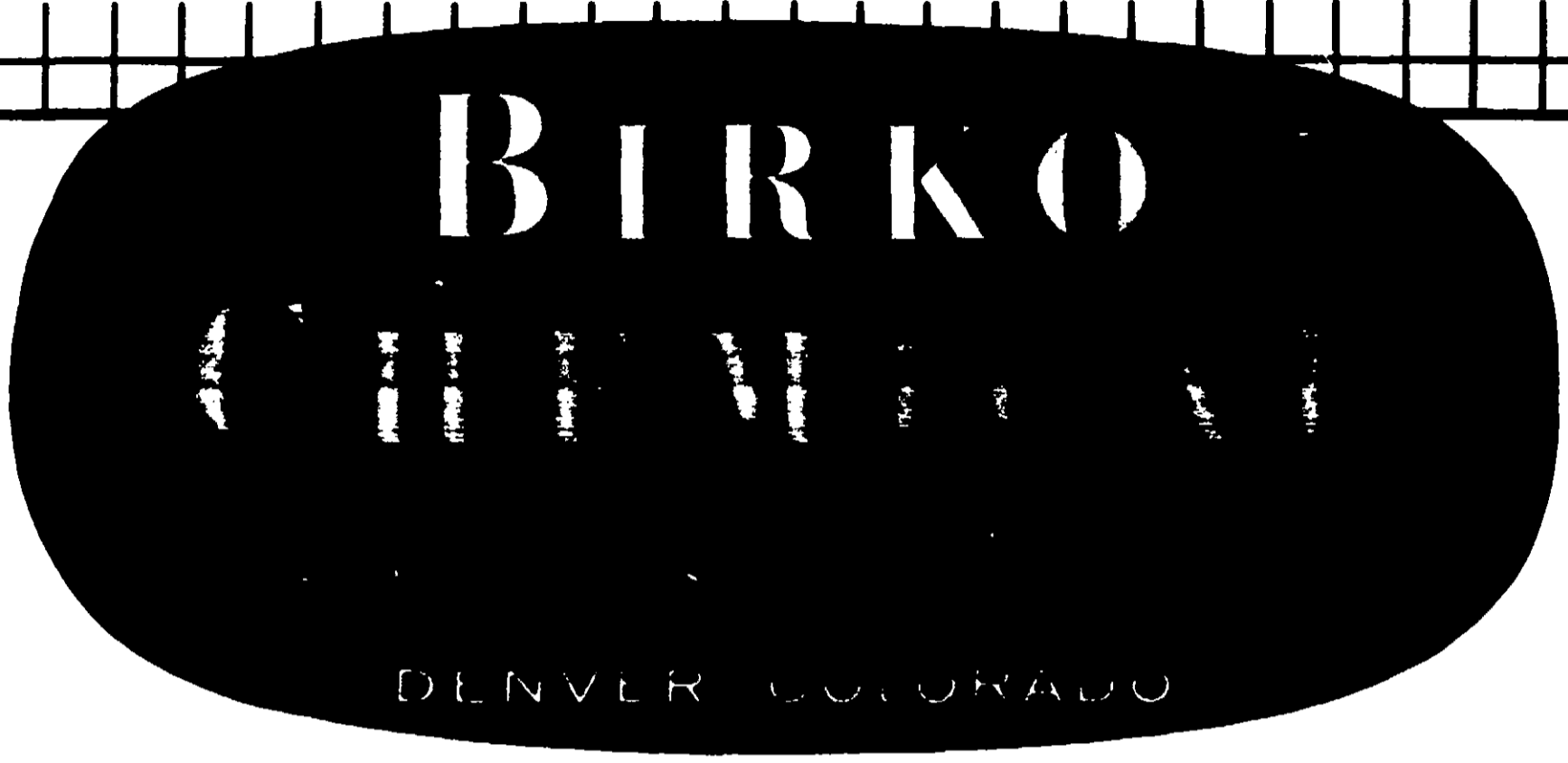

FOR SHELL-EGG CLEANING

DIRECTIONS

- A—1. To clean, use 4 pounds of EGG WASH per 50 gallons of water.
- 2. After cleaning, apply as a sanitizing solution, 1 1/4 pounds EGG WASH per 50 gallons of water. Check concentration with chlorine test kit.
- B—1. Wash eggs promptly after gathering.
- 2. Do not try to clean excessively dirty eggs.
- 3. Water with an iron content in excess of 2 parts per million should not be used.
- 4. Do not immerse eggs in wash water for more than 5 minutes.
- 5. Do not reuse wash water except when used in a continuous type washer.
- 6. Wash water temperature to be at least 90° F. or higher.
- 7. Maintain wash water at a temperature 20° F to 40° F warmer than the eggs.
- 8. After cleaning treatment, spray rinse and sanitize as recommended in A-2 above.
- 9. Eggs should be reasonably dry before casing or breaking.
