Dear Ms. Lamas:

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes indicated below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. You must add the PHI for potatoes (7 days).

2. In the comments section under the crop heading for endive, head and leaf lettuce, parsley, spinach, and swiss chard, you must change the number of applications to be no more than 5 applications per crop, as per the instructions in the GDE letter.

Submit two copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. A stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

# AGRICULTURE USE REQUIREMENTS


Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agriculture workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE) and restricted-entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

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GOWAN SEVIN BAIT is recommended for control of armyworms, cutworms, crickets, darkling ground beetle, grasshoppers and sowbugs on crops listed.

# MAY BE USED ONLY IN CALIFORNIA AND ARIZONA

Recommended dosage rates refer to pounds of GOWAN SEVIN BAIT per acre unless otherwise specified. Use suitable ground or aircraft equipment which provides good distribution. Apply when pests appear in damaging numbers and repeat in accordance with comments if necessary, and observe use limitations given for specific crops. Evening applications are preferred.

DO NOT USE WHEN BEES ARE PRESENT

Subsequent planting of food or feed crops in treated soil must be made with crops on this or other carbaryl label(s).
