NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Antidote—administer atropine sulfate in large doses, TWO to FOUR mg. intravenously or intramuscularly as soon as cyanosis is overcome. Repeat at 5 to 10 minute intervals until signs of atropinization appear. 2-PAM chloride is also antidotal and may be administered in conjunction with atropine. DO NOT GIVE MORPHINE OR TRANQUILIZERS. Parathion is a strong cholinesterase inhibitor affecting the central and peripheral nervous systems and producing cardiac and respiratory depression. At first sign of pulmonary edema, the patient suculd be given supplemental oxygen and treated symptomatically. Continued absorption of the poison may occur and fatal relapses have bean reported after initial improvement: VERY CLOSE SUPERVISION OF THE PAT-IENT IS INDICATED FOR AT LEAST 48
