
WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application. For any requirements specific to your State or Tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exception pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted-entry interval. APPLES, PEARS - Aphids, Leafhoppers, Pear psylla, Mites (except rust mites): Apply 1-2 lbs. per 100 gals. of water. Do not apply within 28 days of harvest. Do not apply when fruit trees or substantial number of weeds in the orchard (grove) are in bloom. Do not graze livestock in treated orchards. (2 lbs. maximum).
