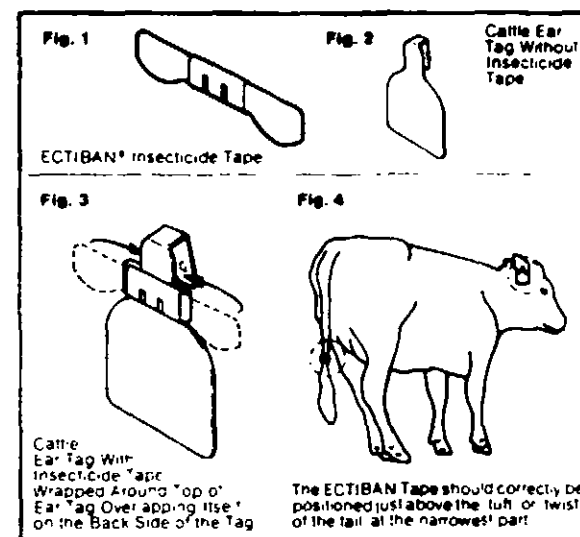
USE DIRECTIONS: For control of horn flies and face flies on dairy
and beef cattle and calves.

Either wrap around existing ear tags, as shown in Figs. 1-3, to control
horn flies and face flies.

Or wrap around tail as shown in Fig. 4, to control horn flies.

After wrapping tape around ear tag or tail, it is activated by rupturing
internal ampule with thumb pressure to release chemical.

One tape per animal is sufficient. Replace as necessary.

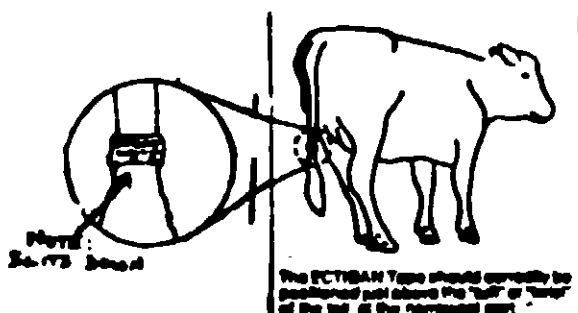

SUPPLEMENTAL LABEL

ECTIBAN® Insecticide Tape

TAIL APPLICATION

For 2-3 months horn fly control, ECTIBAN Tape may be applied to tails of cattle at the narrowest point just above the "tuft" or "twist". Tail application will not control face flies. Slits should be pointing down.



To activate tape, press with thumb to break 2 internal ampules and release insecticide. Then tape should be wrapped as tightly as possible, overlapping ends for best adhesion.

Tail application is recommended for specialized situations such as where it is undesirable or impractical to pierce ears with plastic tags. A significant amount of tape loss from tails may be expected in exchange for the added convenience. Horn fly control will be maintained provided a sufficient proportion of the herd retains tapes (usually 2-3 months). Lost tapes should be replaced when horn flies return to nuisance levels.

NOTE: As with any self-adhesive tape, best retention is obtained when surfaces are clean and dry. Excessively dirty or wet tails must be wiped off, especially, in wet weather or with cattle on lush spring pasture. Operators hands should be clean and dry. Failure to take such steps may result in excessive tape loss.

Tail application should be made after shedding of winter coat. Retention is poor on calves, due to their naturally small tails.
