STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

FIRST AID: If patient has stopped breathing, immediately remove from contaminated area, then start artificial respiration, preferably by mechanical means if available. Immediately give several glasses of water and induce vomiting by forcing the victim with a finger placed on the back of the victim's tongue. Give fluids until vomiting is clear. If victim is unconscious, do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth.

IF INHALED: Remove from contaminated atmosphere. If breathing has ceased, clear the victim's airway and start mouth-to-mouth artificial respiration which may be supplemented by the use of a bag-mask respirator or a manually triggered oxygen supply capable of delivering one liter per second or more. If the victim is breathing, oxygen may be delivered from a demand-type or continuous-flow respirator. Treat only with a physician's advice. Get medical attention immediately.

IF ON SKIN: Under a safety shower, immediately flush all affected areas with large amounts of running water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Do not attempt to neutralize with chemical agents. Get medical attention immediately. Wash clothing before reuse.

IF IN EYES: Immediately flush the eyes with large quantities of running water for a minimum of 15 minutes. Hold the eyelids apart during the flushing to assure flushing of the entire surface of the eye and lids with water. Do not attempt to neutralize with chemical agents. Obtain medical attention as soon as possible. Oils or ointments should not be used at this time. Continue the flushing for an additional 15 minutes if a physician is not immediately available.

POISON SYMPTOMS:—This product is a highly toxic cholinesterase inhibitor. Symptoms include headache, blurred vision, weakness, nausea, dizziness in the chest, abdominal cramps, vomiting, diarrhea, salivation, sweating and general fatigue.

ALWAYS CALL A PHYSICIAN IN CASE OF SUSPECTED POISONING. ATROPINE BY INJECTION IS ANTI-DOTAL.
CALL A PHYSICIAN FOR PESTICIDE EMERGENCY IMMEDIATELY: If a person ingests, inhales, or if poisoning is suspected, do not wait for symptoms to develop. Immediately initiate the recommended procedure above. Simultaneously contact a physician, or the nearest hospital, or the nearest Poison Control Center. Inform the person contacted of the type and extent of exposure, describe the victim's symptoms, and follow the advice given. Note: Be sure to advise the physician that the compound is a cholinesterase inhibitor, and follow the physician's advice.

INFORMATION FOR PHYSICIAN:—Initial measures include removal of soiled clothing, maintenance of a patent airway and if necessary, artificial respiration. When symptoms are relieved, atropine may be administered in large therapeutic doses, repeated as necessary to the point of tolerance. If symptoms warrant further treatment, propamethiodide (pratolone chloride, 2-PAM chloride) has shown utility as adjunctive therapy. Never use morphine. Continued absorption of the poison may occur, resulting in a fatal relapse after initial improvement, very close supervision of the patient is indicated for at least 48 to 72 hours.

FATAL IF SWALLOWED, INHALED OR ABSORBED THROUGH THE SKIN. RAPIDLY ABSORBED THROUGH THE SKIN. Do not get in the eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Do not breathe spray mist.

When handling, wear a NIOSH-approved positive pressure air supplied full face piece respirator, rubber or polyurethane w/a rubber boots and latex natural rubber gloves. This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. DIRECTIONS FOR USE
It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Formulators using this product are responsible for obtaining EPA registration for their formulated products. This product is intended only for formulation into and use products for any of the use patterns listed below:

- Terrestrial, non-domestic, food uses on asparagus beans (dry lima and green), beans, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, cole crops (seed only), corn (field, sweet and pop), rice (peppermint and sweet), onion (bulb), peanuts, peppers, potatoes (fresh and green), radishes, sorghum (grain), strawberries, sugarbeets, sugarcane and tomatoes.
- Terrestrial, non-domestic, non-food uses on ornamental turf (Bougainvillea, banyan, Bougainvillea, St. Augustine grass and bromegrass) and tobacco.
- Domestic outdoor use on lawn beans (snap), beans (fava), beans, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, corn (piloncillo (white), potatoes (sweet), radishes, tomatoes and strawberries.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL
Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. When handling, wear all previously specified protective equipment. Open drums only when set on end and under ventilated hood. Before removing closures, loosen slowly to relieve pressure. To empty drum, fill with water, connect one valve to an open vent pipe and the other to a closed storage or impregnation system. Never use pressure to empty.
STORAGE: Empty containers: Exercise due caution to prevent damage and leakage. Containers should be stored in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area away from food and food stuffs.
