### **POISON SIGNS (Symptoms)**

Parathion is a very dangerous poison. It rapidly en ters the body on contact with all skin surfaces and eyes. Clothing wet with this material must be removed immediately. Exposed persons must receive prompt medical treatment or they may die.

Some of the signs and symptoms of poisoning are Headache nausea, vomiting cramps weakness. blurred vision, pin-point pupils, tightness in chest, labored breathing, nervousness, sweating, watering of eyes, drooling or frothing of mouth and nose, muscle spasms and coma.

### + FIRST AID TREATMENT +

Call a doctor (physician), clinic or hospital immediately. Explain that the victim has been exposed to parathion and describe his condition.

If breathing has stopped, start artificial respiration immediately and maintain until doctor sees victim. If swallowed and victim is awake (conscious) make him vomit quickly. Induce vomiting by sticking finger down throat or by giving soapy or strong salty water to drink. Repeat until vomit is clear. Never give any thing by mouth to an unconscious person. Have victim lie down and keep quiet. See doctor immediately.

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. See doc tor immediately.

### NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Antidote - administer atropine sulfate in large doses TWO to FOUR mg\_intravenously or intramuscularly as soon as cyanosis is overcome. Repeat at 5 to 10 min ute intervals until signs of atropinization appear ? PAM chloride is also antidotal and may be admin istered in conjunction with atropine DO NOT GIVE MORPHINE OR TRANQUILIZERS Parathion is a strong chol:nesterase inhibitor affecting the central and peripheral nervous systems and producing cardiac and respiratory depression. At first sign of pulmonary edma, the patient should be given supple mental oxygen and treated symptomatically Con tinued absorption of the poison may occur and fatal relapses have been reported after initial improve ment. VERY CLOSE SUPERVISION OF THE PATIENT IS INDICATED FOR AT LEAST 48 HOURS

### POST TREATED AREA

Consult your State Agricultural Extrasion Service or Experiment Station regarding posting treated areas

### CONTAINER DISPOSAL

Flush container with water. Destroy container when empty by puncturing, crushing, or burying away from food or water supplies.
