

CAUTION

If bleach is splashed in eyes, flood with water. If bleach is swallowed, feed milk. CALL PHYSICIAN. If bleach is splashed on skin, wash off with water.

DO NOT USE AMMONIA OR TOILET BOWL CLEANERS WITH BLEACH.

To do so, will release hazardous gases. Do not use this bottle for storage of any liquid except bleach.

TOILET BOWLS: Clean, flush, pour in ½ cup bleach; swish solution over inside. Let stand 10 minutes; flush.

DIRECTIONS

USE bleach on white and colorfast cotton, linen, nylon, rayon, acetate (Chroinspun), polyester (Dacron), acrylic (Orlon), modacrylic (Dyne), triacetate (Arnel), and blends of these fibers.

Permanent press fabrics, both white and colorfast, are bleachable.

DO NOT USE on silk, wool, mohair, leather, spandex, non-fast colors. Dilute bleach before using on any fabric.

BLEACH TEST for COLORS: Most colorfast fabrics are bleachable. If in doubt, before laundering with bleach the first time, soak inconspicuous portion of the fabric 5 minutes in solution of 1 tbsp. bleach to 1 gallon of hot sudsy water. Before treating stubborn stains, make same test using ¼ cup bleach to 1 quart clear water.

LAUNDERING: Bleach whitens whites, cleans up colors, removes oily body dirt, disinfects, deodorizes, removes stains.

Top-loading automatics — 1 cup per load

Wringer-type washers — 1 cup per load

Front-loading automatics — ½ cup per load

Use bleach with any good laundry soap or detergent. If your washer has an automatic bleach dispenser, follow washer directions. If not, add bleach whichever way is more convenient.

1. To wash water before laundry is put in, or . . .

2. If laundry is put in before wash water, then dilute bleach in quart of water and add after machine has started agitating and fabrics are thoroughly wet.

FOR HAND LAUNDERING — use ¼ cup bleach per 2 gallons water. Mix before wash is added.

STUBBORN STAINS (fruit, vegetable, food coloring, grass, coffee, tea, wine, tobacco, scorch, mildew): Mix ½ cup bleach per gallon of hot water. Before laundering, soak entire stained item in this solution for 5 minutes. Rinse well. Repeat if necessary. Use cool water for stains set by heat — such as egg, milk, blood; and colored or delicate fabrics.

BATHROOM AND KITCHEN CLEANING — To disinfect, deodorize and remove stains (bathtubs, basins, sinks, refrigerators, stoves, tile woodwork): Wash. Then wipe with solution of ¼ cup bleach per gallon of warm water. Rinse. If stains persist, keep wet 5 minutes with bleach solution. Repeat if necessary. (DO NOT USE bleach on steel, aluminum, silver or chipped enamel. Do not apply bleach with natural sponge.)
