The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments reflected on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

Based on your certification, the Agency has accepted the labeling changes that are necessary to comply with the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) labeling requirements of 40 CFR part 156, subpart K, described in PR Notices 93-7 and 93-11. Any other labeling changes submitted in connection with this amendment application but not directly related to compliance with the WPS have not been reviewed or accepted by the Agency. If you wish to make such changes, you must submit a separate amendment application proposing them. If your product is currently suspended, the acceptance of this labeling amendment does not affect the suspension in any way.

- BEFORE selling or distributing any product bearing the final printed labeling AND

FORD'S DURSBAN FIRE ANT 10% GRANULAR INSECTICIDE

The following specific comments pertain to your WPS labeling submission concerning the product cited above:

User Safety Recommendations must either be placed in a box or printed on the label in a contrasting color from surrounding text.

Add the following User Safety Recommendation to the label in the location shown in Section A on Part 1 of the Product Worksheet in Supplement Three-A to PR Notice 93-7: "Remove clothing immediately if pesticide gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing."

You must retain from your original label any statements about entry restrictions that apply to the non-agricultural uses on your product. Create a Non-Agricultural Use Requirements box in the Directions For Use section of your labeling and add the statements: "The requirements in this box apply to uses of this product that are NOT within the scope of the Worker Protection Standard for agricultural pesticides (40 CFR Part 170). The WPS applies when this product is used to produce agricultural plants on farms, forests, nurseries, or greenhouses." Then add to the box the statements that are in brackets [] on your original label. Please refer to the instructions for creating a Non-Agricultural Use Requirements box starting on page 45 of Supplement Three to PR Notice 93-7 (Main Labeling Guidance).

Delete the crossed-out statements on your proposed label. They are redundant statements or phrases.

Agricultural Use Requirements

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted-entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

Container Disposal: Completely empty bag into application equipment. Then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

General: Consult Federal, state or local disposal authorities for approved alternate procedure, such as limited open burning.

TO TREAT NURSERY GRASS SOD:

- 1. Apply this product to nursery grass sod with application equipment capable of uniform distribution at a rate of 40 to 60 lbs. per acre. A 4-week certification period is provided when 40 lbs. per acre is applied. 60 lbs. per acre provides a 10-week certification period.
- 2. Immediately after treatment, irrigate treated area with at least 1/2 inch of water or a sufficient volume to thoroughly soak below the cut line.

TO TREAT FIELD GROWN WOODY ORNAMENTALS (Balled and Burlapped Stock):

- 1. To be used as a preharvest treatment on non-food bearing field grown woody ornamentals. Use this product in combination with an imported fire ant bait approved by USDA (APHIS/PPQ) for use in the fire ant quarantine program.
- 2. Apply this product 3 5 days after approved bait application, with equipment capable of uniform distribution at a rate of 60 lbs. per acre or 1 lb. per 750 sq. ft. (6 lbs. a.i. per acre). This application will provide a 60-day certification period following a 30-day exposure period.
- 3. To extend certification period retreat area with this product every 90 days.
- 4. Use this product only in accordance with USDA guidelines.
