If In Eyes: Hold eye open and rinse gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

IMPORTANT: Read the entire directions for use before using Supatimber Clear Type B.

APPLICATION

Supatimber Clear Type B may be applied by dip, pressure or double vacuum methods. Solution uptake and treatment conditions for each method should result in a 0.04 to 0.10 pcl retention of active ingredient in the treated article. Treated wood should be used only for above ground uses that are continually protected from direct exposure to the weather.

For pressure treatment, follow the general requirements of American Wood Preservers' Association Standard C-1. For dip treatment, immerse wood completely until enough solution has been absorbed to meet the retention requirements given above. Use dip treatment procedures consistent with the equipment being used and standard treatment practices.

For double vacuum treatment, stack the wood in the treatment vessel so that it will remain submerged. Pull vacuum of -10 inches for five minutes. Fill the vessel, allow the pressure to return to atmospheric and discharge preservative solution. Pull vacuum of -20 inches and maintain for 20 minutes. Return pressure to atmospheric and drain preservative.

Supatimber Clear Type B can be tank-mixed with other pesticide products labeled for wood treatment. Read and follow the label of each tank mix product used for precautionary statements, directions for use, application rates, and other restrictions.

STORAGE & DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Pesticide Storage: Store in a cool, dry place.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the hazardous waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.
